WEEKLY RECAP

November 20, 2017 through November 26, 2017

DWLS, Warrant and OWI Arrests

Between November 20th and November 26th, FPSD personnel made seven misdemeanor driver license related and warrant arrests, and three operating while intoxicated arrest as a result of conducting proactive traffic enforcement.

Ordinance Violation

On November 21st a Farmington property owner reported that an unknown charity placed a donation collection box on their property without permission. Follow up in the matter revealed that the collection box is owned by Golden Recyclers of Dearborn. The Michigan Attorney General's Office is currently investigating Golden Recyclers for placing bins and fraudulently advertising that the donation is charitable, when in fact the proceeds are not supporting any charity, but for the profit of the stakeholders of Golden Recyclers.

Possession of Narcotic Equipment

On November 23rd at approximately 8:22 pm a 19 year old male and 28 year old female were issued citations for possession of narcotic paraphernalia and open alcohol in a motor vehicle. After receiving a complaint of a suspicious vehicle in the area of Longacre and Oakland Streets, Officers located the vehicle and made contact with the occupants. The Officer reported that the vehicle smelled of marijuana and a glass container was observed on the floor of the vehicle which the male occupant was attempting to hide with a towel. Officers searched the vehicle and confiscated one glass pipe, a large glass bong, plastic baggies with green residue and two 40 oz. beers. The female occupant submitted to a Preliminary Breath Test (PBT) that resulted .18(1).

Possession of Narcotic Equipment

On November 25th at approximately 1:55 am a 23 year old male was arrested for possession of narcotic paraphernalia and DWLS. An Officer on patrol in the area of Grand River Ave and Halsted observed a vehicle that crossed the white fog line multiple times and failed to signal when turning. After stopping the vehicle and talking with the driver the Officer learned that the driver did not have a valid license and there was a warrant for their arrest. As a result, the driver was arrested and during the inventory search of the vehicle a metal marijuana grinder was found in the center console of the vehicle.
