### SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

#### Suspicious Person

On July 15<sup>th</sup> an officer responded to the 22000 block of Maple St. for a report of a suspicious male. Upon arrival the officer learned from the complainant that approximately 2 hours earlier a middle aged male of Greek or Arabic descent knocked on her door to inquire whether she was willing to sell one of the cars in her driveway. The complainant had to tell the man several times that she was not interested in selling her car, but he continued to be pushy. The man eventually left but his behavior made the complainant suspect that he was trying to scam her. A report was filed.

#### Open Burn

On July 15<sup>th</sup> officers responded to the area of Brookdale between Nine Mile and Grand River Ave for heavy smoke in the area. Upon arrival, officers were able to locate the cause of the smoke as an open burn of scrap vinyl siding. Officers located the homeowner who admitted that the scrap vinyl siding was from him re-siding his garage, but he denied intentionally burning the siding in his fire pit as a way to get rid of it. The homeowner was cited for burning trash.

#### Fraud

On July 16<sup>th</sup> a Drakeshire Apartment resident reported to the police department that he had been the victim of a scam. The complainant advised that he was sub-leasing a room in his apartment and had published an ad on craigslist. The complainant was contacted by a Californian woman who sent the victim a check for \$4,500 and requested that he send \$3,000 back to her via a third party. The victim sent the money and later learned from his bank that the check was fraudulent. The case was forwarded to the detective bureau for further investigation.
