### SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

#### Suspicious Damage

On October 11<sup>th</sup> an officer responded to the Drakeshire Apartment complex for a report of a smashed window. Upon arrival the officer met with the victim who advised that she had parked her car for about 7 hours in the parking lot and when she returned to it, she noted that the rear window was smashed. The officer could not determine what had smashed the window and no items were taken or moved inside the car. The victim does not have any enemies and does not know how the window broke.

#### Assault and Battery

On October 12<sup>th</sup> officers responded to the Antonio's Liquor store on Orchard Lake Rd. for a report of an assault. Upon arrival officers interviewed the victim and learned that the victim had parked his truck in the business next to the party store because the party store's parking lot was full. As the victim walked to the store's entrance, he was confronted by an Arabic male who was angry about where the victim parked. The victim apologized, but the suspect grabbed the victim by the neck. The victim pulled away from the suspect and the suspect attempted to strike the victim with a liquor bottle. At that point the victim was rescued by Antonio's Liquor employees who intervened and brought the victim into the store. Officers noted that the victim's windshield wiper was broken off of his truck. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

#### Larceny in a Building

On October 13<sup>th</sup> an Oakland Rd. resident reported at the police front desk that a handgun was stolen from her home. The victim reports that her home experienced a house fire several weeks ago and that since that time she has been living in a hotel. The victim reports that several people have been in and out of her home while the insurance company repairs the damage that was done by the fire. On October 12<sup>th</sup> the victim was allowed to enter her home to retrieve some personal items and when she
