SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

Theft

On September 20th officers responded to a home on Shulte St. for a report of a theft. Upon arrival officers learned that the victim had placed his laptop on Facebook Marketplace for sale. The victim was contacted by a potential buyer and they arranged to meet at the victim's home to conduct the sale. The suspect arrived at the home with a friend, but did not leave his car. The victim gave the laptop to the suspect so he could inspect it but the suspect took the laptop and fled the scene. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Identity Theft

On September 20th a Farmington Rd. resident reported at the police front desk that he was the victim of an identity theft. The victim advises that he received a letter in the mail from the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services and informed that his pandemic unemployment payments will soon cease. The victim investigated further with the State of Ohio and learned that an unknown person had filed for unemployment with the State of Ohio. A report was filed.

Malicious Destruction of Property

On September 23rd an officer responded to the Brookdale Condominium complex for a report of a damaged door. Upon arrival the officer spoke with the victim who advised that he had come home to discover that his apartment door had been damaged by unknown means. The victim does not know who may have damaged the door.

Flee and Elude

On September 23rd an officer on patrol observed a Dodge Durango traveling on Grand River Ave without a license plate. The officer attempted to stop the vehicle, but it accelerated and headed north on Orchard Lake Rd. The officer noted that the road was slick from the recent rain and that the suspect

was driving recklessly, so he terminated the pursuit for safety reasons. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Attempt Stolen Auto

On September 25th an officer responded to the Drakeshire Apartment Complex for a report of an attempt stolen auto. Upon arrival the officer learned that the victim had parked her vehicle in the parking lot at 1 AM and at 3 AM her boyfriend noticed that the rear window was smashed out of the new Dodge Durango. The officer noted that the ignition wires had been tampered with, but also noted that there was blood in the vehicle (presumably from the suspect). Evidence was collected and the case was forwarded to the crime lab for evidence processing.
