SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

Malicious Destruction of Property

On September 6th an officer responded to a report of a malicious destruction of property at the Riverglen Condos. Upon arrival the officer spoke with the victim who advised of the following: The victim had returned home from being out to discover a hole in one of her condo windows and glass on her floor. The victim noticed a BB pellet on her floor so she called the police. The officer noted that it appeared that an unknown person had fired a BB pellet at the window, damaging same. The victim does not know who shot her window. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Stolen Auto

On September 6th an officer responded to a report of a stolen auto at the Jamestown Apartment complex. Upon arrival the officer spoke with the victim who advised that he had left for a weekend vacation and when he returned he noted that his 2016 red Dodge Challenger was missing. The vehicle was a rental and the rental company advised that they did not repossess the vehicle. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Larceny from Auto

On September 6th an officer responded to 3 separate larceny of automobile airbags in the Bel Aire subdivision. The officer learned from the 3 victims that sometime overnight an unknown person or persons had stolen the airbags from the 3 vehicles. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Scam

On September 10th a Mayfield resident had reported that she had been a victim of a fraud and needed to make a report. The victim advised the officer that she had received an email from what she believed

was PayPal advising that there was a pending charge to her PayPal account and that she should contact the provided phone number if she did not make the charge. The victim called the phone number and spoke with a man who told her that the only way he can verify if there are fraudulent charges to her PayPal account is for her to download his software so that he can check her computer. The victim complied and gave the man control of her computer. After dealing with the man, the victim contacted PayPal through their public phone number and learned that they did not have any record of any transactions. In addition, the victim checked her bank account and learned that over \$800 was stolen out of her account. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Damage to Police Vehicle

On September 10th an officer on patrol observed a vehicle parked in a darkly lit area of the Freedom Gateway church at approximately 10:40 PM. The officer noted that the church was closed, that the vehicle was occupied by two individuals, and that no one should be at the church at this hour. The officer noted that the two occupants were a male and partially clothed female in the back seat of the vehicle. As the officer approached the vehicle and tried to make contact, the male climbed into the front seat of the vehicle, started the car, and began to back up the vehicle. The officer started knocking on the driver's window yelling at him to stop so the driver accelerated the vehicle until he crashed into the officer's patrol vehicle. The officer was able to take custody of the driver, learning that the driver was a juvenile. The juvenile was charged with the incident and turned over to a parent.
