SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

Larceny from Auto

On February 8th officers responded to the 7-11 on Grand River Ave for a report of a purse stolen from the front seat of a parked vehicle. Upon arrival officers interviewed the victim who advised that she had parked her vehicle at pump 7 and pumped gas into her vehicle. The victim went into the store to purchase some items and when she returned she noticed that her purse was missing from the front seat of her unlocked vehicle. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Fraud

On February 9th a Farmington Rd. resident came into the police department to report that he was the victim of a fraud. The victim advised that he had received a message on his computer advising that illegal child pornography was found on his computer and that he needed to call Microsoft at a certain phone number. The victim called the phone number and was told that his computer had been hacked and that he needed to provide \$9,000 to the suspect in Home Depot gift cards. The victim did as he was instructed and realized that he was the victim of a fraud. The case was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Larceny in a Building

On February 10th an officer responded to the Brookdale Condominium complex for a report of a stolen boiler system. Upon arrival the officer learned from the maintenance employee that he was receiving complaints of no heat in several of the buildings. Upon arrival the maintenance employee discovered that the boiler had been removed by an unknown suspect. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Suspicious Circumstance

On February 11th officers responded to a home on Hayden St. for a report of a suspicious person reporting to work for the utility company and entering a home. Upon arrival the officers learned from the complainant that a 40 year old white male with a heavy accent knocked on her door, advising that

he had turned off water to the street behind her home and that he needs to check her water to insure that the water was off. The complainant allowed the man into her home and he convinced her to fill a bucket of water and then to put it out in her backyard. The complainant left the suspect in her home for a minute and when she returned the suspect left the home in a Ford SUV. Afterwards the complainant noticed that an empty safe of her had been moved from one room to another. The complainant did not have any items missing.

Larceny in a Building

On February 12th the money card machine from the Farmington Place Apartment laundry room was found in the Shiawassee Park with all the money missing from it. Further investigation revealed that at approximately 4:26 AM 3 males in a pick up truck had stolen the money card machine from the building and then drove it to the park where they forced the machine open to take the cash. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.
