



WEEKLY REPORT

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (11-4705)

On September 5th, at approximately 3:30 a.m., a vehicle was stopped at Grand River and Wilmarth for tinted windows and crossing the center line. The officer detected the odor of intoxicants. The driver admitted to consuming three beers at a friend's residence on Power Road. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .13(7). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (BAC .14%).

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED/CARRYING A CONCEALED WEAPON (CCW) VIOLATION (11-4726)

On September 6th, an officer observed a vehicle fail to signal upon turning from northbound Halsted onto eastbound Grand River. The vehicle was also observed to enter the westbound lane upon completion of the turn. A traffic stop was conducted at Grand River and Blanchard. The officer detected the odor of intoxicants. The driver admitted to having several shots at Champs Bar in Detroit. The driver had a valid CCW permit and a loaded Kel Tech 9mm handgun under the driver seat. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .10. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (BAC .10/.11) and Carrying a Concealed Weapon while intoxicated. The weapon and ammunition were confiscated. The Oakland County Gun board was notified of the offense.

WIRE DOWN (11-4757)

On September 7th, at 2:00 p.m., officers responded to a wire down on Brookdale Street. Upon arrival, officers found a power line down in the northbound lane of Brookdale Street. An officer stood by and blocked traffic as well as kept citizens away from the wire until DTE arrival.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (11-4769)

On September 8th, an officer observed a vehicle eastbound Grand River from Halsted with tinted windows. The vehicle was observed to weave within its lane and cross the outer lane marker. A traffic stop was conducted at Grand River and Drake Road. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants but the driver denied consuming alcohol. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of

.14(6). The driver then admitted to having some beers at a friend's house in Novi. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (BAC .15%) and the vehicle was impounded.

SOLICITORS (11-4799)

On September 9th, officers responded to the Warner Farm's and Alta Loma subdivisions for a report of door to door sales. Upon arrival officers located a male subject in the Warner Farms subdivision working for Sierra Solutions Cleaning Products. The man did not have a permit and was advised of city ordinance.

RETAIL FRAUD (11-4813)

On September 10th, at 11:17 a.m., officers responded to Big Lots on a report of a retail fraud that had just occurred. Store security had chased the black male suspect to the area of Grand River and Orchard Lake. Officers arrived and searched the area but were unable to locate the suspect. One officer returned to the store to take the report and the other officer remained in the area to attempt to locate the suspect.

Approximately thirty minutes later, an officer observed a suspect matching the description. The officer stopped the subject and interviewed him. The subject was eventually arrested for the retail fraud. Upon his person he had the merchandise that he had stolen from Big Lots. Additional investigation revealed that he had also stolen merchandise from ACO Hardware.

WELFARE CHECK (11-4821)

On September 10th, at 8:19 p.m., an officer was flagged down at Farmington Road and Nine Mile by a motorist who advised that he had seen a nine year old female walking around the intersection appearing confused. The officer located the child who advised that she had been out for a walk and was having difficulty finding her apartment (which was across the street). The officer contacted the child's guardian (grandmother) who picked up the girl and drove her home.

SUSPICIOUS PERSON (11-4822)

On September 10th, officers responded to the City Park for a report of a white male approaching small children. Upon arrival officers located the subject who was passing out religious literature. The male was identified and sent on his way.

MALICIOUS MISCHIEF (11-4823)

On September 10th, officers responded to the area of Warner Street and Thomas for a report of three juveniles throwing eggs at cars. Upon arrival officers learned from the reporting person that the three teens had thrown eggs at his vehicle and then ran to the stairs that lead to the City Park. Officers checked the area and were unable to locate the three teens.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (11-4829)

On September 11th, an officer stopped a vehicle for improper lane use near Grand River and Smithfield. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants. The driver denied consuming alcohol. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .13(3). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (BAC .15%) and subsequently admitted to consuming alcohol at her mother's residence while watching football.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (11-4830)

On September 11th, an officer stopped a vehicle for failing to stop for a traffic signal and not using its turn signal. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants. The driver admitted to drinking four beers at Player's Bar and Grill (Farmington Hills). The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .10(2). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (BAC .13%) and his vehicle was impounded.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (11-4831)

On September 11th, an officer stopped a vehicle for improper lane use on eastbound Grand River near Halsted. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants. The driver (nineteen years old) admitted to having a few beers at a friend's residence. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .13. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (BAC .12%) and his vehicle was impounded.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (11-4832)

On September 11th, an officer stopped a vehicle for having window tint, loud exhaust and a license plate cover/obstruction. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants. The driver admitted to drinking before picking up her fiancé. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .12(1). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (BAC .14%). Her vehicle was turned over to her fiancé who responded to the scene.

EXTRADITION ARREST WARRANT (11-4837)

On September 11th, at 2:10 p.m., this department was notified by a bail bondsman that a subject at the Rockets football game at Farmington High School had a warrant for drunk driving out of the Oakland County Sheriff's Department. Officers responded to the football game and detained the subject in question. After running the subject through the Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) it showed that the subject also had a felony warrant out of Florida for forgery. The Oakland County Sheriff's Department did not want to pick the subject up on their warrant, but the police agency out of Florida did. The subject was transported to the Oakland County Jail where he will be held until the agency out of Florida arrives.
