DRUG PARAPHERNALIA/WARRANT OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT (11-5581)

On October 25th an officer observed a vehicle travelling eastbound M-5 from Halsted with a cracked tail light emitting white light to the rear. A traffic stop was conducted on eastbound M-5 near Farmington Road. The officer learned the driver had an outstanding warrant out of Farmington Hills Police Department for drug paraphernalia. The driver consented to a search of the vehicle. The officer located a crack pipe in an aspirin bottle on the front passenger seat and confiscated same. The officer issued the driver a citation for drug paraphernalia. The driver was turned over to Farmington Hills police on their outstanding misdemeanor warrant.

HOME INVASION (11-5603)

On October 26th, a homeowner in the 22800 block of Farmington Road reported a house he is restoring (unoccupied) was broken into sometime in the prior forty-eight hours. Stolen was the copper pipe he installed during the restoration.

FOUND PROPERTY (11-5636)

On October 28th, a resident from the Belle Aire Subdivision came into this police department with a tin tackle box containing World War II medals, memorabilia, and personal letters. The resident advised that she had found the items next to her driveway at her home. Officers noted dog tags in the tin box belonging to a deceased man who had lived in Hartland, MI. Officers were able to locate the son of the man who advised that his father had passed away in July and that they were currently having an estate sale of his belongings. The items were turned over to the son who advised that the woman who is managing the estate sale lives in Farmington and must have dropped the items when she took them home to appraise them.

OPERATED WHILE INTOXICATED 1st OFFENSE (11-5639)

On October 29th, at approximately 1:45 a.m., an officer was clearing a traffic stop when he observed a vehicle drive by with a flat tire. The officer stopped the listed vehicle at the Muirwood Apartments entrance. Upon investigation, the

officer determined that the twenty-one year old female driver was intoxicated. She was arrested and transported to the station. At the station, she submitted to a breath test which revealed her BAC to be .18. She was held until sober and released.

OPERATED WHILE INTOXICATED 1st OFFENSE (11-5653)

On October 30th, at approximately 2:45 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle near Grand River and Halstead for speeding. Subsequent investigation determined that the driver had been drinking. The driver failed field sobriety tests and a Preliminary Breath Test (PBT). The driver was arrested and transported to the station where he submitted to a breath test which revealed his BAC to be .13. He was held until sober and released.
