ASSIST OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT WITH A SUICIDAL PERSON (11-5786)

On November 7th, a man walked into the police department to report a suspicious text message that he had received from an ex-girlfriend who had advised that she had taken fourteen pills and just wanted to say goodbye to him. Farmington police learned from the man that the ex-girlfriend had recently been evicted from her home and that he does not know where she is living now. The investigating sergeant discovered that the ex-girlfriend's cell phone is carried by AT&T. The sergeant contacted AT&T who was able to locate the female through her cell phone. The female was located at a trailer park in Sterling Heights. Sterling Heights police were contacted who located the suicidal female and committed her to the local hospital.

CREDIT CARD FRAUD (11-5787)

On November 8th, at approximately 2:30 a.m., a resident reported a credit card fraud that had occurred at the Valero Station at Grand River and Orchard Lake Road. The resident stated that an unknown suspect made four ATM debit withdrawals without his permission. The resident stated that he did not know who made the transactions but stated that he had misplaced his ATM card for a period of time.

Subsequent investigation by detectives revealed that the withdrawals were made by a family member in the same household as the resident. The resident refused to prosecute.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA (11-5824)

On November 10th, at 1:30 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle for speeding at Grand River and Grove. Upon making contact with the driver and occupants of the vehicle, the officer smelled marijuana coming from inside. A search of the vehicle revealed a small baggie of marijuana under the passenger seat. A twenty-year old female was arrested and transported to the station. The arrested female was processed and held for arraignment.

ASSIST OTHER POLICE AGENCY (11-5841)

On November 11th, at 2:11 a.m., our department assisted Farmington Hills Police Department in setting up a perimeter in the area of Shiawassee and Inkster.

Farmington Hills had experienced several Larceny from Vehicles that had been witnessed in progress. A dog was called to the scene and a track conducted with negative results. Officers cleared the scene at approximately 3:00 a.m.

LARCENY IN A BUILDING (11-5851)

On November 11th, at approximately 4:20 p.m., a man came home to his house on Marblehead and found his bedroom ransacked and his back door wall unlocked. The man advised police that he had left for work in the morning and that nothing was disturbed. The man discovered several items missing from his bedroom including an Xbox and a laptop computer. The man also advised that the bedroom of his roommate appeared to have been ransacked as well. The investigating officers interviewed the roommate who confessed to having staged the burglary so that his friends could steal the items from his roommate. Two search warrants were conducted on the friend's homes and the property was retrieved. Three suspects were arrested in this larceny.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED/CHILD ENDANGERMENT (11-5858)

On November 12th, an officer observed a vehicle westbound Grand River near Brittany Hill with its bright lights activated and driving 58 mph in a 45 mph zone. The officer conducted a traffic stop with listed vehicle at Grand River near Halsted. The driver had his wife and two children (one and two years old) in the vehicle. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. The driver indicated he had two beers at a family party at Drakeshire Apartments. The driver failed field sobriety tests and submitted to a PBT with a result of .13(4). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated Child Endangerment. The driver's wife did not have a license and the children were turned over to her. The vehicle was impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a BAC of .16. The driver was held pending warrant submittal to the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office for Child Endangerment.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (11-5869)

On November 13th, an officer observed a vehicle travelling 40 mph in a 25 mph zone on eastbound Grand River near Liberty with its headlights off and stopped the vehicle at Grand River and Farmington Road. The officer made contact with the female driver and observed two open beer cans in the center console. The officer also detected a strong odor of intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. The driver admitted to having a few beers at an unknown hotel where she was visiting a friend. The driver was on the way home to Chesterfield Township. The driver subsequently failed field sobriety tests and submitted to a PBT of .15(2). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated. The vehicle was impounded. The driver refused a breath test at the station and a blood search warrant was authorized by a magistrate. The officer issued the driver a citation for Operating While Intoxicated and Open Intoxicants in a Motor Vehicle. She was held until sober.
