ANIMAL COMPLAINTS (11-5976 and 11-6001)

On November 21st and 22nd, dayshift officers responded to two animal complaints of sick raccoons both of which had to be destroyed by officers.

NEIGHBOR TROUBLE (11-5982)

On November 20th, at approximately 4:30 p.m., a resident of Kensington Manor Apartments came into the police department to report that she had a verbal altercation with one of her neighbors. The resident had been using the community laundry room and had left her clothes in the dryer. When she came back to retrieve her clothing, she found her clothes laying on top of the dryer and someone else's clothes inside the dryer. The resident waited around for the owner of the clothes to retrieve same and when he did she informed him that she did not want him touching her clothes. An argument ensued over the resident monopolizing the community laundry room and words were exchanged. The resident wanted the incident documented in case something happened later.

NEVER ACQUIRED DRIVER'S LICENSE/WARRANTS (11-5984)

On November 20th, an officer on patrol heading east on Grand River near Brookdale, observed another eastbound vehicle with illegal tinted windows. The officer stopped the vehicle for the violation and learned that the twenty-eight year old driver did not have a driver's license and had a warrant for her arrest. In addition, the driver had three previous convictions for not having acquired a driver's license in the past. The driver was arrested and charged with Never Acquired Driver's License and the warrant.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED – 3rd OFFENSE (11-5986)

On November 21st, at approximately 1:30 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle near Grand River and Halstead for failing to signal and drifting out of its lane. Subsequent investigation revealed the driver had been drinking and the driver failed field sobriety tests. A preliminary breath test (PBT) was given with a result of .18. The driver refused the Datamaster at the station and a search warrant was obtained for a blood withdraw. The subject has two prior Operating While Intoxicated convictions on his driving record making this arrest a felony.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED- 1st OFFENSE (11-5987)

On November 21st, at approximately 2:00 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle near Nine Mile and Gill for drifting over the double yellow on a couple of occasions. The driver who was eighteen years old had been drinking. The driver failed field sobriety tests and a PBT was administered (.07). The driver was arrested and transported to the station where the driver submitted to the Datamaster with a result of .11.

MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY (11-5990)

On November 21st, officers responded to a Malicious Destruction of Property at Riley Park. Unknown suspect(s) kicked a hole in the bathroom wall during the weekend.

DOMESTIC ASSAULT/BARRICADED GUNMAN (11-5992)

On November 21st, at 3:30 p.m., officers responded to a domestic assault report at Chatham Hills Apartments. Officers tried to make contact with the suspect at the apartment who was possibly armed and had a child inside. After knocking on the door, the suspect made statements that indicated a danger to officers and possibly the child inside. Officers also heard what appeared to be a gun 'racking' and objects being placed in front of the door. Officers secured the building and area and Oakland County Special Response Team was contacted and responded. The suspect eventually was talked out of the apartment and later charged with domestic assault.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE (11-6007)

On November 22nd, at 1:37 a.m., officers were dispatched to Stonehouse Court on a report of a woman who had just been assaulted by a man with a gun. Upon arrival, officers searched the area and did not find anyone. An officer made the scene and spoke to the reporting party. It was learned that the reporting person had been hallucinating due to medications she is currently taking and no crime had occurred.

OPERATING MOTOR VEHICLE UNDER INFLUENCE OF DRUGS (11-6016)

On November 22nd, at 3:30 p.m., officers were dispatched to a traffic crash on M-5 at the Nine Mile Road exit. Officers found a single vehicle accident where the vehicle had crashed through the guardrail. The driver appeared to be under the influence of drugs and was found to have a prior conviction for Operating While Intoxicated. The driver was transported to Botsford Hospital. A search warrant for blood was obtained. Charges are pending.

ASSIST OTHER POLICE DEPT (11-6029)

On November 23rd, at 10:30 a.m., Farmington officers responded and assisted Farmington Hills police on a bank robbery where shots had been fired at the Comerica Bank at Grand River and Middlebelt.

**OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED II/ATTEMPT TO DISARM AN OFFICER/
RESISTING ARREST (11-6033)**

On November 23rd, at 3:20 p.m., an officer observed a vehicle proceed into and through the Ten Mile Road/Orchard Lake intersection at a high rate of speed and nearly caused three accidents. The officer pursued the vehicle with lights and siren and finally stopped

same approximately one mile away. Upon making contact with the driver it was determined the subject was highly intoxicated and became belligerent. When the officer advised the subject he was under arrest and attempted to handcuff him, the driver pulled away and resisted the officer. The driver continued to resist and fight with the officer. When the officer attempted to use a taser, the driver grabbed the taser and fought the officer for it. The officer maintained control and a citizen assisted the officer in holding the driver until additional officers arrived. The driver had a BAC of .19 and a prior conviction for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI). The driver was transported to Providence Hospital for a voluntary blood draw. Upon arriving at hospital the driver became very loud and belligerent. The hospital refused to provide a voluntary service and requested he be removed. The driver then fought and resisted the two officers who had transported him. The case was presented to the Oakland County prosecutor and the subject was charged with OWI (second offense), Attempt to Disarm a Police Officer of a non-lethal weapon, and two counts of Resisting and Obstructing a police officer.

POSSESSION OF NARCOTIC PARAPHERNALIA (11-6040)

On November 23rd, at approximately 9:30 p.m., a public safety commander observed a dark blue Chevrolet Yukon in the area of Grand River and Power Road with a headlight out. The commander stopped the vehicle and informed the driver the reason for the stop. While interviewing the occupants of the vehicle, the commander detected a distinct odor of burnt marijuana emitting from inside the vehicle. All three occupants denied possessing anything illegal inside the vehicle. A search was conducted and a marijuana pipe was located in the rear seat where one of the passengers had been seated. The passenger confessed to owning the pipe and same was arrested for being in possession of narcotic paraphernalia. The seventeen year old was transported to this police station where he was turned over to his father.

POSSESSION OF DESIGNER DRUGS (11-6044)

On November 24th, at approximately 1:30 a.m., an officer observed an occupied vehicle while completing an apartment watch at Kensington Manor Apartments. The officer made contact with the occupants who were friends and just talking inside the vehicle. While speaking with the subjects, the officer smelled marijuana. A search of the vehicle was conducted and the designer drug K2 or Spice was discovered. The male passenger admitted the drug was his and he was arrested. The driver was arrested, transported to the station and released. The drugs will be sent to the Oakland County Crime Lab for identification.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED - 2nd OFFENSE (11-6045)

On November 24th, at approximately 2:20 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle for speeding at Farmington Road and State Street. The driver had been drinking and failed both field sobriety tests and a PBT (.14). The driver was arrested and transported to the station where he submitted to the Datamaster with a result of .13. The subject has one prior Operating While Intoxicated conviction on record.

THANKSGIVING

Thanksgiving was a very slow night on the afternoon shift, only a couple of alarms

(unfounded) and we assisted Farmington Hills Police Department in arresting a drunk driver at Grand River and Halsted.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED/WARRANTS OTHER DEPARTMENTS (11-6066)

On November 25th, at 10:20 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle for motor carrier violations and found the driver had seventeen suspensions with four prior convictions for driving on a suspended license. The subject also had nine warrants from three different police departments. The driver was arrested.

FELONY WARRANT OTHER DEPARTMENT (11-6069)

On November 25th, at 1:00 p.m., an officer responded on an abandoned vehicle complaint. Upon checking the license plate in the computer, it was found the registered owner had a felony warrant for stolen property out of the Michigan State Police. The owner was repairing the vehicle when the officer arrived and was arrested.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (11-6086)

On November 26th, at approximately 4:00 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle at Grand River and Lilac for drifting in and out of its lane. The driver who had been drinking failed both field sobriety tests and a PBT (.20). The driver was arrested and transported to the station where he submitted to the Datamaster with a result of .21.

PERSONAL INJURY ACCIDENT/POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA (11-6088 and 11-6089)

On November 26th, at 5:15 a.m., officers responded to Grand River and Wilmarth for a vehicle that had left the roadway and struck a utility pole. The driver was outside the vehicle when officers arrived. It was determined that the driver had fallen asleep while driving and left the roadway. The driver was transported to the hospital for evaluation. Upon doing an inventory search of the vehicle prior to it being towed, officers discovered marijuana in the center console of the vehicle. The driver was issued for reckless driving and possession of marijuana.

LARCENY IN A BUILDING (11-6099)

A resident of Chatham Hill's Apartments reported that someone had stolen a gold cross from his apartment the night of November 25, 2011. The resident advised that he had a female friend visiting who brought another female friend over that the resident had never met before. The resident had placed the cross in the living room and then went to bed as the two females stayed up and watched TV. When the resident awoke in the morning, he discovered that both females were gone as well as his gold cross.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (11-6109)

On November 27th, at approximately 3:30 a.m., an officer stopped a vehicle at Orchard Lake and Lamar for a prohibited turn. The driver who had been drinking, failed field sobriety tests and a PBT registered (.15). The driver was arrested and transported to the station where she submitted to the Datamaster with a result of .16.

OPERATE WHILE INTOXICATED, THIRD OFFENSE (11-6125)

On November 27th, at approximately 7:45 p.m., a public safety sergeant on patrol stopped a tan Nissan Altima at Grand River and School Street for driving over 60 mph in a 35 mph zone. A subsequent investigation revealed that the lone male driver had been consuming intoxicants. The man was arrested for Operating a motor vehicle While Intoxicated (OWI). A review of the man's history revealed that he was arrested for OWI in Novi in 2003 and for OWI in California in 2003. The man was held until sober and his case is forwarded to the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office for a warrant request for OWI 3rd offense.
