



## WEEKLY REPORT

December 19 – 25, 2011

### **PERSONAL INJURY ACCIDENT**

On December 17<sup>th</sup>, at 1:40 p.m., officers responded to an injury accident at Grand River and Mooney. Both drivers suffered injuries and both were transported to the hospital.

### **HOUSE FIRE**

On December 19<sup>th</sup>, officers were dispatched to a report of a house fire at a home on Lee Lane. Officers learned that the caller had originally called Farmington Hills Fire Department and according to them that the fire was out. Upon arrival officers learned that the fire was still burning on the stove and had extended to the kitchen cabinets. The fire was quickly extinguished by public safety officers and contained to the stove and kitchen cabinets.

### **LARCENY FROM BUILDING**

On December 19<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 7:25 p.m., two males entered the Bargain Book Store and stole approximately \$200 from the cash register. The employee who reported the crime advised that one of the males distracted the clerk on one end of the store while the other stole the money from an easily opened older cash register. The clerk knew something had happened when the two males left the store because a book that is kept on top of the cash register to alert employees that the register had been tampered with had been moved. Officers checked the area for the males but were unsuccessful in locating them.

### **OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED**

On December 20<sup>th</sup>, an officer observed a vehicle pull into the alley behind the Uptown Plaza near Grand River and Mooney. The officer conducted an investigative stop on the vehicle. The driver indicated she was coming from a holiday party and waiting for her boyfriend. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The driver failed sobriety tests and submitted to a PBT with a result of .16(8). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and her vehicle was impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a BAC of .16. A citation for OWI was issued and the driver held until sober.

### **EMBEZZLEMENT**

On December 20<sup>th</sup>, O'Reilly Auto Parts reported an employee had been embezzling from the business. The amount was under \$1000 and the employee confessed to both the manager and the responding officer. The report has been forwarded to the prosecutor.

### **OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED, SECOND OFFENSE**

On December 21<sup>st</sup>, an officer observed a parked vehicle behind JAMS located at 32620 Grand River. The business was closed. The vehicle attempted to exit the business upon observing the patrol vehicle. A traffic stop was conducted. The driver indicated he was just talking with his passenger. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants. The driver failed field sobriety tests and submitted to a PBT with a result of .18(4). The officer noted the driver had a previous conviction for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) in Royal Oak in 2005. The driver was arrested for OWI II and the vehicle was impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a BAC of .22 and .22. The driver was held until sober and report forwarded to the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office for OWI II.

### **LARCENY OF A CREDIT CARD**

On December 21<sup>st</sup>, a teenager came into the police department to report the following: The teen had gone to the Subway Restaurant at Farmington Road and Nine Mile and had put her debit card in her back pocket. When the teen arrived home she realized that she was missing her debit card and suspects that it had fallen out of her pocket at the restaurant. The teen returned to the restaurant and was unable to locate her card. Upon cancelling the card with the bank she learned that the card had been used at a gas station in Livonia shortly after she had left Subway. The investigation is ongoing.

### **FELONIOUS ASSAULT WITH A KNIFE**

On December 21<sup>st</sup>, at approximately 4:42 p.m., a resident of Farmington Place Apartments called this police department to report that her neighbor had just threatened her with a knife. Upon arrival officers located the suspect who admitted to threatening the resident with a steak knife. The suspect believes that the resident is conspiring with AT&T and the Girl Scouts by breaking into her apartment and stealing things. The resident denies entering the apartment and advises that the suspect has not been acting rational. The suspect was charged with felonious assault and is being held on \$10,000 bail.

### **GAS LEAK**

On December 21<sup>st</sup>, at approximately 4:50 p.m., a man was backing his vehicle in the parking lot of the JAMS (Grand River/Mayfield) facility when he backed into the natural gas meters attached to the building. Within two minutes of being dispatched, officers arrived on scene. Officers noted that the gas was leaking from the meters at a high rate. The gas was shut off to the building and Consumer's Energy was notified.

### **OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED**

On December 22<sup>nd</sup>, an officer paced a vehicle at 44 mph in a 25 mph zone on Shiawassee from Grand River to Power. A traffic stop was conducted on Power at Leelane. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The driver denied consuming alcohol. The driver subsequently failed field sobriety tests and admitted to consuming shots of liquor. The driver submitted to a PBT with a result of .14(8). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and housed until sober. A breath test at the station revealed a BAC of .18 and .17. The officer issued a citation for OWI to the driver.

**STOVE FIRE**

On December 23<sup>rd</sup>, at 10:53 a.m., officers responded to a stove fire on State Street. The resident reported seeing flames and smoke in the residence. Upon arrival officers found the fire was out and had been contained inside the oven with very light smoke in house. The oven was self cleaning when grease in the bottom caught fire.

**MALICIOUS MISCHIEF**

On December 24<sup>th</sup>, at 10:00 a.m., officers responded to Loomis Street where two cars had been egged. A third car was also found egged on Valley View. No damage to the vehicles.

**BREAKING AND ENTERING**

On December 25<sup>th</sup>, at 1:30 p.m., an officer on patrol found Ardmore Shoes had been broken into. Officers processed the scene for evidence and the owner contacted. It appears only that miscellaneous change was stolen.
