



## WEEKLY REPORT January 16 - 22, 2012

### **CONDITIONAL BOND VIOLATION/MIP**

On January 16<sup>th</sup>, a vehicle travelling westbound on Grand River approaching Orchard Lake was stopped for a loud exhaust and an inoperable passenger side brake light. The vehicle contained three occupants ranging in age from fifteen to nineteen years of age. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. Each occupant was removed from the vehicle and interviewed. The driver (nineteen) had not been drinking. The fifteen and seventeen year old passengers submitted to a PBT with a result of .05(8) and .07(1) respectively. The officer searched the vehicle and located a pint of alcohol in the fifteen year old's purse. The driver also had a conditional bond order from a judge of the 47<sup>th</sup> District Court to have no contact with the fifteen year old. The driver was arrested on the violation of the conditional bond order. The officer issued the seventeen year old a citation for Minor in Possession (MIP) and petitioned the fifteen year old juvenile on charges of MIP and Open Intoxicants in a Motor Vehicle. The juvenile was turned over to her mother.

### **LARCENY IN BUILDING**

On January 16<sup>th</sup>, at 3:30 p.m., a report of larceny was taken at the front desk that occurred the previous night. The victim, an employee of Luigis, left her purse near the coat rack at the entrance to the business. When she returned to the purse two hours later it was gone. The victim was provided information for canceling credit cards, obtaining a new license and given an Identity Theft packet just as a precaution.

### **POSSESSION OF TOBACCO**

On January 16<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 5:53 p.m., a Silver Dodge Ram pick up truck was stopped for speeding on Shiawassee Road, 42 mph in a posted 25 mph zone. Upon approaching the seventeen year old driver and his two minor aged friends, the officer noted that the seventeen year old had tobacco on his breath. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver was in possession of tobacco and had evidence of marijuana use in his vehicle. The driver was cited for possessing the tobacco and for speeding.

### **SKATEBOARD VIOLATION**

On January 16<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 6:07 p.m., an officer on patrol observed five teenagers skateboarding at the downtown pavilion. The officer recognized three of these teenagers as subjects who had been warned about skateboarding downtown previously. The officer took custody of the skateboards and held them for twenty-four

hours, to be picked up by a parent or guardian. The officer cited three of the teenagers for being in violation of the skateboard ordinance and warned the other two.

### **SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE**

On January 17<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 8:58 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the 22000 block of Violet for a vacant home with its outside faucet running. Upon arrival the officer learned from neighbors that a contractor has been working on the home over the past few weeks and may have left the water running. The officer turned off the water to the faucet.

### **DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED**

On January 19<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 4:51 p.m., an officer stopped a vehicle for disobeying the red light at Grand River and Orchard Lake. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license for failing to comply with judgments out of Livonia and Detroit. The man was arrested and charged with driving with a suspended license.

### **SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE**

On January 19<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 8:01 p.m., officers were dispatched to Drakeshire Apartments for an odor of marijuana emanating from one of the apartments. Upon arrival officers noted that the odor was coming from a separate apartment. Officers knocked on the door, but no one would answer. The information was forwarded to the Narcotic Suppression Unit.

### **OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED SECOND OFFENSE**

On January 20<sup>th</sup>, a vehicle was stopped for running a red traffic light at Drake and Grand River. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle and the driver admitted to having one drink at his friend's residence in Commerce. The driver failed field sobriety tests and refused a PBT. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. The driver provided an invalid breath sample at the station and a search warrant for blood was authorized by a court magistrate. CEMS arrived at the station and a blood draw was completed. The case was forwarded to the detective bureau pending blood analysis by MSP on charges of OWI II.

### **MUTUAL AID- FIRE ASSIST**

On January 20<sup>th</sup>, at 4:00 p.m., four officers and an engine responded to Bridgeman in Farmington Hills on a request for assistance at a house fire. Responding officers assisted in extinguishing the fire and checking for extension.

### **ASSIST OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT**

On January 21<sup>st</sup>, at approximately 6:20 p.m., officers were dispatched to the Farmington Road and Ten Mile Road area to look for a sixteen year old special needs runaway from a group home in Farmington Hills. Upon arrival officers located the teenager at Ten Mile Road and Elizabeth Court. The teen advised that he no longer wanted to live at the home because he felt that he would murder one of the staff if he stayed. Officers

asked the teen to sit in a patrol vehicle to be driven to the group home and he took off running towards oncoming traffic. The teenager was grabbed onto by officers and taken down to the ground in order to be handcuffed. The teen was turned over to Farmington Hill's police who committed him due to suicidal and homicidal threats that he started making.

### **LARCENY IN A BUILDING**

On January 21<sup>st</sup>, at approximately 8:31 p.m., officers responded to the Farmington Place Apartments for a report of a stolen purse. Upon arrival the victim and her friends advised that they were socializing and putting a puzzle together when two teenagers kept coming into their area to use the vending machines. When the victim got up to leave she noticed that her purse was missing. The victim knew who one of the teenagers was and confronted him before calling the police. Officers interviewed the teenager who denied stealing the purse. The suspect's grandmother, a resident of the building, advised officers that her grandson was seen taking out the garbage and putting it in the garbage chute shortly after being confronted. Officers checked the garbage compactor and located the purse in a grocery bag owned by the grandmother. The victim was returned her purse, but she advised that cash and a cell phone were missing. With the grandmother's permission, officers went to her apartment where her grandson was visiting. Officers called the victim's cell phone and heard it ringing in the apartment's bathroom. Officers located the cell phone in a dresser drawer in the bathroom. The teenager was arrested for the larceny and charged with the crime. The teenager has a history of aggravated assault, Malicious Destruction of Property and incorrigibility.

### **OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED**

On January 22<sup>nd</sup>, an officer stopped a vehicle for improper lane use and improper signaling near Nine Mile and Folsom. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The twenty-two year old driver admitted to consuming a couple of drinks at the Post Bar in Novi. The driver failed field sobriety tests and submitted to a PBT with a result of .18(9). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a result of .21 and .20. The officer issued a citation for OWI and the driver was held for arraignment/sobriety.

### **OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED**

On January 22<sup>nd</sup>, an officer observed a vehicle travelling eastbound on M-5 near Halsted at a very high speed. Radar confirmed 104 mph in a 70 mph zone. A traffic stop was conducted eastbound on M-5 near Orchard Lake Road. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. The twenty-eight year old driver admitted to consuming alcohol in Ann Arbor and was just trying to get home to his residence in Canton. The driver failed field sobriety tests and refused to submit to a PBT. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a result of .22. The officer issued a citation for OWI/PBT refusal to the driver. The driver posted bond and was held until sober.
