LARCENY OF LANDSCAPE LIGHTS

On March 12th, an officer was dispatched to the 23200 block of Power Road on a delayed larceny report involving landscape lights taken from a home that was for sale. Unknown when landscape lights were taken.

PERSONAL INJURY CRASH

On March 15th, at 4:11 p.m., the afternoon shift responded to a crash with injuries on Grand River, west of Mooney Street. A car turning left into the Uptown Plaza failed to yield the right of way to an SUV traveling westbound Grand River. A head on crash resulted in substantial damage to both vehicles and sent both drivers to the hospital with minor injuries. The driver at fault was cited for failing to yield and operating an uninsured motor vehicle.

SOLICITORS

On March 15th, afternoon shift officers were dispatched to the area of Marblehead and Power for the report of solicitors. Officers located the subjects and learned they were going door to door as a contract company for AT&T. The subjects had applied for permits in Farmington Hills and were unaware that they had entered the City of Farmington. The subjects were advised to obtain city permits and returned to Farmington Hills.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On March 16th, an officer observed a vehicle travelling the wrong direction in a one way alley near Grand River and Farmington Road. The officer followed the vehicle and noted it to sway in its lane. The vehicle also stopped in the middle of the intersection at Grand River and Orchard Lake Road on a red signal. A traffic stop was conducted. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The driver admitted to having three Vodka's at the Basement Burger Bar. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .19(4). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a result of .20. A citation for OWI was issued and the driver was held until sober.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On March 16th, an officer conducted a traffic stop with a vehicle at Nine Mile and Farmington Road for improper lane use. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The driver denied consuming alcohol. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .10(0). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle

impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a result of .12. A citation for OWI was issued and the driver held until sober.

RETAIL FRAUD

On March 16th, an officer was dispatched to Antonio's Liquor on Orchard Lake Road on a report of two shoplifters being detained by employees. Upon arrival, employees informed the officer that the suspects were juveniles and they did not wish to prosecute, but wanted both subjects told not to return to the store. Both juveniles were transported home and turned over to their parents.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On March 17th, an officer on patrol noticed a vehicle with defective taillights at Grand River and Cass. Upon making contact with driver, it was found that the driver's driving privileges were suspended and he had numerous traffic warrants out of other agencies. The driver was arrested for Driving While License Suspended and the outstanding warrants.

DISTURBANCE/WARRANTS OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENTS/POSSESSION OF DRUG PARAPHERNALIA

On March 17th, officers were dispatched to the parking lot of Flagstar Bank on a reported disturbance involving a male and female arguing. Upon arrival the female subject was found to have narcotic paraphernalia (Crack pipe) in her possession. The male subject was found to have several outstanding warrants with other departments, but they all advised they could not pick up. The male subject was released. The female subject was cited for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and released.

DISORDERLY PERSON/POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA/POSSESSION OF NARCOTIC PARAPHERNALIA

On March 17th, officers were dispatched to Pages Bar on a report of an intoxicated male trying to get into a vehicle. Officers were advised that the intoxicated male also urinated on a vehicle in the parking lot. Upon arrival, the subject was found and was highly intoxicated. During contact with the subject, the subject was found to be in possession of Marijuana, and Marijuana pipe. The subject was arrested for Disorderly Intoxication, Possession of Marijuana and Possession of Narcotic Paraphernalia.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED 1st OFFENSE

On March 17th, at approximately 11:00 p.m., an officer stopped a vehicle near Grand River and Halstead for weaving while it was traveling westbound on Grand River. The driver admitted to drinking at a local bar and was asked out of the vehicle to perform field sobriety tests. The driver failed field sobriety tests and a preliminary breath test. The driver was arrested and transported to the station where he submitted to a Datamaster with a result of .11.

ZERO TOLERANCE

On March 18th, an officer observed a vehicle eastbound on Grand River east of Blanchard following too closely to a vehicle in front of same. The officer also noted the vehicle to straddle the eastbound Grand River lane markers. A traffic stop was conducted in the

parking lot of the 7-11 at Grand River and Drake. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The driver (seventeen years old) denied consuming alcohol and blamed the odor on some rubbing alcohol in the vehicle. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .06(0). The driver then admitted to consuming Smirnoff Vodka at a St. Patrick's Day celebration. The driver was arrested for Zero Tolerance and the vehicle impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a result .06. A citation for Zero Tolerance was issued and the driver held until sober. The parents of the driver were advised of the citation in the morning.
