



WEEKLY REPORT April 16 – April 22, 2012

UNLAWFUL DRIVING AWAY OF AUTOMOBILE

On April 16th, at 3:25 a.m., this police department responded to Hawthorne Street for the report of a stolen auto. The reporting party advised that her son is a known drug user and she believes that he stole her vehicle in order to get to Detroit to purchase narcotics. When the vehicle was returned unharmed, the reporting party declined to cooperate and press charges.

ASSIST FARMINGTON HILLS POLICE DEPARTMENT ON DISORDERLY PERSON

On April 17th, officers assisted Farmington Hills police with a disorderly person at Diamond Forest Apartments that they were attempting to interview and detain. The subject was detained by Farmington Hills police prior to arrival, and this department stood by until further Farmington Hills police units arrived.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE

On April 17th, at 10:47 p.m., officers were dispatched to Shiawassee and Hawthorne for a suspicious circumstance. The reporting person stated he pulled up to the corner where he observed two juveniles drop a bike and run east from that location. Officers checked the area and were unable to find the juveniles. The bike, which has not been reported stolen, was collected and taken to the station.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED/DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On April 18th, 2:54 a.m., a vehicle was stopped on westbound M-5 for speeding and crossing the fog line. An odor of intoxicants was detected and the driver was subsequently arrested for drunk driving and having a suspended driver's license.

PARKING COMPLAINT

On April 18th, an officer was dispatched to the parking lot of Marilyn Maher and Associates on a reported vehicle parked in the parking lot in a posted "No Parking" zone. Upon arrival, the vehicle was found to belong to an employee of Verizon who was unloading boxes in the strip mall adjacent to the business. The owner agreed to remove the vehicle without incident and was advised not to park there anymore which she agreed not to.

POSSESSION OF NARCOTIC PARAPHERNALIA

On April 19th, at 3:04 a.m., a vehicle with an expired license plate was observed parked in a gas station parking lot with a male attempting to work on wiring under the steering wheel. A LEIN check of this individual revealed prior drug activity, and consent to search his vehicle

was obtained. A search of the vehicle produced a marijuana bong which was confiscated and destroyed. The driver was released from the scene with a citation for Possession of Narcotic Paraphernalia.

MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

On April 19th, an officer was dispatched to the Warner Farms Subdivision on a report of graffiti spray painted on the crosswalk near Frederick Street. Graffiti "Hi Jane" was found spray painted on sidewalks throughout the subdivision. No suspect(s) at this time. The Department of Public Works was contacted to clean the sidewalks.

FAMILY TROUBLE/THREATENING COMPLAINT
