



WEEKLY REPORT April 23 – April 29, 2012

SMOKE INVESTIGATION

On April 23rd, at 11:55 p.m., residents of Chatham Hills Apartments called advising that a neighbor's smoke alarm had been going off for a half hour. Upon arriving at the complex, the beeping was initially heard but then stopped soon after. There was no answer at the door, so maintenance made entry with their key. There was nobody home at the apartment, but there was a light haze and smell of smoke that originated from a home chicken rotisserie machine that had been left on. Officers unplugged the machine and left a business card advising that we had been there.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On April 23rd, at 2:00 a.m., a vehicle was stopped at Grand River and Middlebelt for travelling 110 mph on eastbound M-5. The Mexican male driver was unable to provide proper identification. The male was subsequently arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (.11) and U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) put a hold on him because there was no documentation that he had entered this country legally.

NATURAL GAS LEAK

On April 24th, officers were dispatched to the River Glen Condominiums on a report of a construction crew that had broken a gas line during excavation of the parking lot. Upon arrival, officers evacuated the condominium units in the vicinity of the gas leak. Officers also evacuated the Village Commons Mall until Consumers Energy representatives arrived on scene and were able to stop the leak. The evacuation was less than an hour.

OUTDOOR FIRE

On April 24th, officers were dispatched to Farmington Public Schools Administrative building on a report of a fire in the mulch adjacent to the building. Upon arrival, officers found the mulch smoldering and extinguished same via booster line and tank water from Engine 3. It appears the mulch may have caught fire after someone discarded a lit cigarette in the mulch.

WARRANT ARREST OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT

On April 25th, as a result of a motor carrier traffic stop for equipment violations at Grand River and Halsted, the driver was found to have a civil warrant out of the Warren Police Department. The driver was arrested and turned over to Warren police.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On April 25th, at 10:50 p.m., an officer stopped a vehicle near eastbound M5 and Farmington

Road for a plate violation. The driver of the vehicle was suspended and had a warrant out of Redford Police Department. The driver was arrested and transported back to the station where she was processed and housed awaiting arraignment.

HOME INVASION

On April 26th, an officer was dispatched to the 32300 block of Lee Lane on a report of a Home Invasion. Upon arrival a contractor who was doing work on the house under construction, reported the appliances, cabinets, fixtures, and Jacuzzi tub missing from the house. Upon further investigation, it was found that the homeowner is going through foreclosure proceedings and removed the items from the home himself.

CUSTOMER TROUBLE

On April 26th, at 4:09 p.m., officers were dispatched to Comerica Bank for a customer trouble. Upon arrival, officers learned that a customer was angry with the bank because they would not re-finance a business loan that they had with Comerica. The customer agreed to leave the bank and left without incident.

SMOKE INVESTIGATION

On April 27th, at 12:28 a.m., officers responded to Chatham Hills Apartments for a report of a lamp sparking and smoking. Upon arrival the lamp was unplugged and the apartment was ventilated to clear the smoke.
