



WEEKLY REPORT May 21 – 27, 2012

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On May 21st, at approximately 5:41 p.m., an officer stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River Avenue and Orchard Lake Road for disobeying a red light. Further investigation revealed that the driver had four suspensions on his driver's license and five warrants for his arrest. The man was arrested for Driving While License Suspended and housed at the Farmington jail.

OPEN INTOXICANTS IN A MOTOR VEHICLE

On May 22nd, at approximately 7:07 p.m., an officer stopped a red Grand Am for crossing the double yellow several times in the area of Grand River and Pickett. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver had been consuming intoxicants inside the vehicle while driving. The man did submit to a preliminary breath test and passed. The man is on parole with stipulations that he does not consume alcohol. The man was cited for the open can of beer and the report was forwarded to his parole officer for the parole violation.

PROVIDE FALSE IDENTIFICATION TO A POLICE OFFICER

On May 22nd, at approximately 10:44 p.m., a sergeant stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Hawthorne for failing to dim its bright lights for oncoming traffic. Upon approaching the driver the sergeant was advised that the driver did not have any of her identification on her and that she had just left an aunt's home in another city where the family had found the aunt deceased. While the sergeant was checking the name that the driver had given him in the statewide computer, the driver's family drove by the traffic stop and stopped to assist. The sergeant asked the family the name of the driver and they provided the sergeant with a different name. The woman confronted her family members who changed their response to the original name that the driver had provided. The sergeant checked the new name in the statewide computer and learned that she has a suspended license. The driver was arrested and transported to the Farmington jail where her identity was revealed through fingerprints. The driver was cited for providing an officer with a false name and for driving on a suspended license.

ANIMAL COMPLAINT

On May 23rd, an officer responded to Hayden Street to assist Canton police on checking the victim of a cat bite. The victim was fine and Canton police will follow-up with the animal's owner.

ASSAULT AND BATTERY

On May 25th, at 11:50 a.m., an employee of LG Auto Care came into the station to make an Assault and Battery report. The employee stated he and the manager got into a verbal dispute and the manager assaulted him. The incident is under investigation with the assistance of the business owner.

SUSPICIOUS PERSON

On May 25th, at approximately 8:00 p.m., the manager of the Orchard Ten Foods called this police department about a man who has been standing outside his store for five hours and looks homeless. Upon arrival the officers immediately recognized the man as a homeless person that has been banned from several restaurants in the area. The man was heavily intoxicated and was transported to Botsford Hospital by an officer.

ASSIST OTHER POLICE AGENCY

On May 27th, at approximately 7:55 p.m., officers were dispatched to an apartment at Farmington Plaza Apartments to assist the Royal Oak Police Department in locating a strong arm robbery suspect. Officers learned while enroute, the suspect had assaulted an eighty-six year old Royal Oak man and stole several antiques from him. Upon arrival the officers located the man attempting to leave the building. The man admitted to the theft and allowed officers inside his apartment to retrieve the items. The man was arrested for Royal Oak police who picked up the man from this department.

SUSPICIOUS PERSON

On May 27th, at approximately 8:42 p.m., officers were dispatched to a report of an extremely intoxicated male stumbling into the street at Power Road near Cloverdale. Upon arrival officers located the man and recognized him from a previous incident where he was arrested for disorderly intoxication and obstructing a police officer. Officers noted that the man was extremely intoxicated and was offered a ride home. The man accepted the ride and advised that he would go to bed instead of continuing to drink.

TRESPASSING

On May 27th, at approximately 10:02 p.m., officers were dispatched to the Chatham Hills Apartment's pool building for a report of a man who had just broken into the pool area. Upon arrival the officers located the suspect, who had been detained by maintenance. The nineteen year old man admitted to climbing into one of the unlocked windows with his girlfriend in order to go swimming in the pool despite the building being closed. The girlfriend had left the scene prior to being caught. The man is a resident of the complex and management decided to not press charges against him.
