



WEEKLY REPORT July 16 - 22, 2012

LARCENY OF PLANTED FLOWERS

On July 16th, at 2:47 p.m., a Charlestowne Condominium resident declined to make a formal report but wished to advise this police department that flowers from the common ground area had been stolen.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA/NEVER ACQUIRED DRIVER'S LICENSE

On July 16th, an officer stopped a vehicle for excessive braking and improper signaling on Heatherton near Tree Hill. The sixteen year old driver was attempting to locate a friend's residence. The driver had never obtained a driver's license. The officer detected an odor of marijuana in the vehicle. A search of the vehicle was conducted and a small amount of marijuana was located in the glove box. The driver was arrested for marijuana possession and never acquired. The vehicle was turned over to his grandfather. The report and petition were forwarded to juvenile court on charges of Possession of Marijuana and Never Acquired Driver's License.

FIRE ALARM

On July 16th, Officers responded with Engine 3 to the 21000 block of Birchwood for a report of a fire alarm. Upon arrival officers learned that the alarm was falsely triggered by fine dust particles created by plumbers cutting concrete.

MUTUAL AID ASSIST

On July 16th, members of the Oakland County Hazardous Material Team were called to assist the City of Oak Park who was handling a 2600 gallon gasoline spill. Sergeant Madeline is a hazardous member team leader and responded to assist.

DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On July 17th, an officer stopped a Ford Five Hundred in the area of Grand River and Orchard Lake for having an expired license plate. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver has eleven suspensions on her driver's license and a warrant for her arrest for failing to display a valid operator's license. The woman was arrested for driving on the suspended license and housed at the Farmington jail pending bond.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On July 19th, at approximately 7:05 p.m., an officer on patrol located two subjects sitting in a vehicle in a closed business parking lot in the area of Eight Mile and Chesley Road. The officer approached the occupants and noted a suspicious plastic baggie in the front center

console. The officer also noted an odor of marijuana coming from one of the occupants. A subsequent investigation revealed a marijuana pipe and marijuana inside the vehicle. The passenger admitted to owning the illegal items and he was arrested and charged for Possession of Marijuana and Possession of Narcotic Paraphernalia.

EMBEZZLEMENT

On July 20th, at 11:48 a.m., an officer responded to the Farmington Village Family Practice for an embezzlement report. One of four possible suspects stole \$100 from a safe between the dates of July 16th and July 20th. The matter has been turned over to the detective bureau.

RETAIL FRAUD

On July 20th, at approximately 6:30 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the Farmington Founder's Festival for a report of a retail fraud (shoplifting) at a vendor's booth. Upon arrival the officer learned that another vendor had also been victimized. Both vendors advised that two white females between twenty to thirty years of age, had entered their booths to look at jewelry. When the females left the booths, the vendors realized that the jewelry that they had been looking at was now missing. Officers checked the area for the females to no avail.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE

On July 20th, at approximately 9:40 p.m., officers were dispatched to Greenes Hamburgers restaurant for a report of a customer refusing to leave. Upon arrival the officers learned from the staff that the customer is a longtime repeat customer who is acting disorderly. Greenes employees did not want to have a trespassing order given to the man, but simply wanted him to leave for the night. The man left without any problems.

INJURED PERSON

On July 21st, officers responded to the area of The Rocking Horse located at 33350 Grand River. Officers located a man on the sidewalk bleeding profusely from his right arm. Officers applied direct pressure and utilized pressure points to control the bleeding. CEMS was contacted and care was turned over to same. Further investigation determined the intoxicated male fell through the store front window of the Rocking Horse as he walked eastbound on Grand River.

SOLICITORS/WARRANT ARREST

On July 21st, officers responded to the area of the Founders Festival on a report of two white males selling unauthorized cotton candy. The two men had already placed the cotton candy in their vehicle when they were located. One of the men had warrants for his arrest and was turned over to Canton Police Department. Both men were advised not to solicit without a permit any further.

SOLICITORS

On July 21st, at approximately 10:27 p.m., officers were dispatched to Drake Heights for a report of two suspicious white males going door to door selling an alarm system package. Upon arrival officers located only one of the men who admitted that he was going door to door to sell an alarm service. The man advised that he and several solicitors are staying at the Muirwood Apartments complex and that they have a quota to sell a certain number of

contracts. The man did not have a permit to solicit and was cited for the violation. The man was released on the scene.

LARCENY IN A BUILDING

On July 22nd, at 8:54 a.m., a Farmington Place Apartment resident called this police department advising that a man that she had met the night before, and believed to be a fellow resident, had stolen money from her billfold while visiting in her apartment. Further investigation revealed that it does not appear that the man was truthful about living in the apartments. No suspects at this time.

FIRE

On July 22nd, at approximately 7:19 p.m., officers were dispatched to a report of a business on fire at the LG Auto Care (Farmington Road and Nine Mile). Upon arrival officers noted heavy smoke emitting from the front lobby of the business and the roof line. Officers made entry into the business and extinguished the flames. Investigators from the Oakland County Cause and Origin team were contacted to assist this department in determining the cause of the fire.
