



WEEKLY REPORT July 23 - 29, 2012

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED THIRD OFFENSE

On July 23rd, an officer observed a vehicle travelling at a high rate of speed on westbound Grand River near Farmington Road. Radar confirmed 40 mph in a 25 mph zone. The officer stopped the vehicle on Grand River near Farmington Road. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .10(4). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. The driver had two prior convictions out of North Carolina for OWI. The driver submitted to a breath test with a result of .11 and .11. The driver was housed pending warrant submittal to the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office for OWI III.

OBSCENE TELEPHONE CALLS

On July 23rd, at 2:22 p.m., a Kensington Manor Apartments assistant manager advised that she had taken a call from an unknown male caller who began moaning and groaning in a sexual manner. The same male has made several similar calls in the past. Kensington Manor is in contact with Ameritech's call annoyance division.

EMBEZZLEMENT

On January 23rd, at approximately 3:48 p.m., the manager of Drakeshire Apartments came to this police department to report that one of their employees has been embezzling from the company for several months. The suspect not only works at the complex, but also lives there and has been crediting their rental account with other tenant's payments. The case was forwarded to the Detective Bureau.

CHILD ABUSE

On July 24th, at 2:04 p.m., officers responded to Botsford Family Pediatrics for a report of a man abusing a three year old child by throwing him to the ground and beating him in the chest with a closed fist. The family had left the office and a responding officer located them walking on Mooney Street. The victim's mother's boyfriend admitted to hitting the child and was subsequently arrested. The matter has been presented to the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office for a warrant request.

LARCENY OF AUTO PARTS

On July 24th, this department responded to two incidents at apartment complexes (Chatham Hills Apartments and Farmington Plaza Apartments) where the catalytic converters had been cut off of vehicles that had been parked at the complex during the day. There were no witnesses to the crimes and no suspects.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED/DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On July 25th, an officer observed a vehicle northbound on Halsted from Grand River with a cracked windshield. The vehicle was improperly signaling and weaving. A traffic stop was conducted in the Independence Green Apartments. The driver admitted to drinking at Scores Bar. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .12(3). The driver also had six current suspensions on his Secretary of State record. The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and Driving While License Suspended (DWLS). The driver submitted to a breath test with a result of .10. The vehicle was impounded. The driver was held until sober. The driver received a citation for OWI, DWLS, improper plate and a cracked windshield.

FELONY WARRANT OTHER POLICE DEPARTMENT

On July 27th, this department was contacted to assist a subject near Grand River and Halsted. Upon arrival, the intoxicated subject requested transportation to his residence a few blocks away. The officer conducted an inquiry which revealed an outstanding felony warrant for Operating While Intoxicated out of the Wayne County Sheriff's Office (WCSO). The warrant was confirmed and the subject arrested. The subject was housed pending pick up by the WCSO.

CAR THEFT/NEVER ACQUIRED OPERATORS LICENSE

On July 27th, at 2:48 p.m., an officer responded to Drakeshire Apartments for a report of car theft. Upon arrival it was learned that two roommates had an argument and the one roommate took the other's vehicle without permission. The officer called the responsible roommate and had her return the vehicle to its owner. The vehicle owner no longer wished to prosecute since she got her car back, but the driver was arrested for never having acquired a driver license and was issued a citation for same.

COUNTERFEIT MONEY

On July 27th, at 12:06 p.m., the manager for the Dollar Tree came into this police department and turned over a counterfeit ten dollar bill that was passed at his store the day before at 9:50 p.m. by a light skinned black female, approximately twenty-five years old. The matter has been turned over to the Detective Bureau for follow up.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED

On July 28th, an officer observed a vehicle travelling in excess of 40 mph on eastbound Grand River near Farmington Road. The officer also observed the vehicle to weave within its lane. A traffic stop was conducted in the Valero parking lot located at Grand River and Orchard Lake. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants. The driver admitted to consuming alcohol at an unknown bar near 12 Oaks Mall. The driver resides in Virginia and was in town visiting a friend. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .17(5). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a result of .18 and .17. The driver was issued a citation for OWI and housed until sober.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED/DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On July 28th, an officer observed a vehicle travelling at a high rate of speed on eastbound Grand River near Power. Radar confirmed 56 mph in a 35 mph zone. A traffic stop was

conducted at Grand River and Sherwood. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The driver admitted to consuming alcohol at a family reunion. The driver failed sobriety tests with a PBT of .22(7). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. The driver refused a breath test and a search warrant for blood was executed. CEMS was contacted and a blood draw was completed. The driver was booked and housed in the east cell pending receipt of bond money. The driver was issued a citation for OWI and Driving While License Suspended and housed.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED/DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On July 29th, an officer stopped a vehicle for speeding and improper lane use near Grand River and Warner. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .10(0). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. The driver also had a suspended driver's license. The driver submitted to a breath test at the station with a result of .13. The driver was issued a citation for OWI and housed until sober.
