## WEEKLY REPORT October 22 - 28, 2012

### **ELECTRICAL FIRE**

On October 22<sup>nd</sup>, at approximately 8:00 p.m., Engine 3 responded to Peterlin's Restaurant at Farmington Road and Nine Mile for a report of a possible electrical fire. Upon arrival officers learned that one of the electrical outlets had been sparking. Officers cut electricity to the outlet to prevent any further damage.

### **MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY**

On October 23<sup>rd</sup> officers responded to the professional pavilion on a possible breaking and entering. The investigators found a window was broken out, but entry was not made to the building.

### **INTIMIDATION/THREATS**

On October 23<sup>rd</sup>, at approximately 4:10 p.m., an officer was dispatched to a report of a patient threatening a dentist at a local dental office. Upon arrival the officer learned that the patient had been calling the office all day, upset that one of the dentists had caused the patient pain. The man threatened to cut off the dentist's genitalia with a knife over the phone. The man was contacted by the officer and advised to cease any and all contact with the dentist and the office.

### **GAS ODOR**

On October 23<sup>rd</sup>, at approximately 5:29 p.m., officers responded to the concession stand at the Farmington High School football field for an odor of natural gas. Upon arrival the officers were able to determine that the building's hot water boiler has a gas pressure relief valve that occasionally releases pressurized gas.

### **SOLICITOR**

On October 24<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 1:00 p.m., officers were dispatched to Leelane on a solicitor complaint. One subject was found soliciting for Midwest Gutter cleaning and was issued a violation.

### **TRESPASSING**

On October 24<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 7:49 p.m., officers were dispatched to Burger King on Grand River for a report of a teenage male who is trespassing. Upon arrival officers located the male and learned from management that the teen had been told in the past that he has been banned by management from going into the restaurant because of his past conduct.

The teen was advised by officers that if he ever returns to the business, he will be arrested for trespassing.

### **VENDOR**

On October 25<sup>th</sup>, at 2:00 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the Uptown Plaza on a complaint of a hot dog vender in the parking lot without a license. Officers made contact with the subject who stated he had been hired by the plaza owner. The subject was advised on how to apply for a license.

### **OPEN INTOXICANTS IN A MOTOR VEHICLE**

On October 28<sup>th</sup> an officer observed a vehicle parked in the darkened lot of the Valero gas station located at 33330 Eight Mile. The business was closed. The officer made contact with the two occupants and detected a strong odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The driver had not been drinking but the passenger, the registered owner, was too intoxicated to drive. The officer observed an open bottle of Smirnoff Vodka in the backseat under some jackets. Cranberry juice was also observed in the vehicle. The officer confiscated the bottle of Vodka, poured out the contents and discarded the bottle. The officer issued the passenger (registered owner) a citation for Open Intoxicants in a Motor Vehicle and released same.

### **VEHICLE FIRE**

On October 28<sup>th</sup>, at 10:00 a.m., officers responded to a truck fire on Eight Mile. The truck was located behind a business next to the building. Officers had to saw through a large lock/chain to gain access to the vehicle. Damage was limited to the truck. The fire was caused by an engine block heater that was left plugged in.
