## WEEKLY REPORT

June 24 - 30, 2013

### **MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY**

On June 24<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 4:00 p.m., an officer was dispatched to Chatham Hills Apartments on a delayed Malicious Destruction of Property report. Upon arrival, the Reporting Party (RP) stated that sometime over the weekend, the convertible top on his 1969 Chevrolet Corvette was slashed. The RP stated that the Corvette was parked in the parking garage and he has not had any problems with any tenants or anyone else.

### **NEVER ACQUIRED DRIVER'S LICENSE**

On June 24<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 8:45 p.m., an officer was on patrol in the area of Drake Road and Oakland Street. The officer observed a vehicle traveling southbound on Drake Road at an excessive rate of speed. A traffic stop on the vehicle revealed that the driver of the vehicle had never had a driver's license and was currently being investigated by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) as being an illegal alien, with a deportation hearing pending. The driver was subsequently arrested for Never Acquired License. DHS was contacted and stated they would forward the information to the investigator handling the subject's deportation investigation/hearing.

### **ILLEGAL DUMPING**

On June 26<sup>th</sup>, at 2:24 p.m., an officer responded to the rear parking lot of what was formerly K-Mart for a dumping complaint. This was the third time in a month that furniture, clothing and miscellaneous items have been dumped in the loading dock area. The building representative advised that he may install video surveillance in order to identify who may be dumping the items.

### **ILLEGAL DUMPING**

On June 26<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 5:00 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the 35000 of Oakland on a dumping complaint. Upon arrival the officer learned that a couch was dumped on the front lawn of a residence sometime overnight. The reporting party stated that he was unsure, but it could have been the result of a prank being played on his younger brother who lives at the residence. The reporting party stated he would put the couch out for trash pickup on Friday.

### **OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED**

On June 27<sup>th</sup> a vehicle was stopped near Grand River and Farmington Road for driving with high beams activated and a speed of 48 mph in a 25 mph zone. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the vehicle. The driver had glassy blood shot eyes. The driver admitted to consuming wine at Chatham Hills Apartments. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .09(4). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) and the vehicle was impounded. A breath test later revealed a BAC of .11 and .11. The driver received a citation for OWI and was housed until sober.

### **CUSTOMER TROUBLE**

On June 27<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 11:00 p.m., officers were dispatched to the 7-11 at Grand River & Drake on a report of a disorderly person. Upon arrival the officer met with the clerk who stated that earlier in the night (around 9:00 p.m.). A frequent customer came into the store and became upset when he was not acknowledged. The clerk stated that the customer became irate and started cursing at him and another customer. The clerk recognized the responsible as working at a local restaurant in Farmington Hills at Grand River and Drake Road and stated he and the owner wanted the responsible to be contacted and advised not to return to the store. Officers met with the responsible who stated that both he and the clerk both started cursing at one another. The responsible was advised not to return to 7-11 or he would be arrested for trespassing, which he agreed he would not return.

### **OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED/POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA**

On June 28<sup>th</sup> a vehicle was stopped on Farmington Road near Eight Mile for speeding (57 mph in a 40 mph zone). The officer detected an odor of intoxicants coming from the interior of the vehicle. The driver had glassy blood shots eyes. The driver admitted to consuming two beers and cognac at an unknown bar. The driver failed field sobriety tests with a PBT of .17(8). The driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI). During an inventory search of the vehicle, the officer found a baggie of suspected Marijuana in the center console. The officer confiscated the baggie. The vehicle was impounded. The driver subsequently took a breath test at the station with a result of .18 and .17. The driver was cited for OWI and Possession of Marijuana and housed until sober.

### **MALICIOUS MISCHIEF**

On June 28<sup>th</sup>, at 2:29 p.m., officers responded to the area of Floral Street for the report of a two liter bottle exploding. The five teens who were responsible for the blast were located and advised of the danger and possible ramifications of following the directions that they learned on You Tube. Parents were advised of what the teens had done.

### **POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA/MINOR IN POSSESSION**

On June 29<sup>th</sup> a vehicle was stopped on Grand River near Hawthorne for a broken passenger side brake light. The officer observed green leafy material consistent with Marijuana on the driver's side floor board. The officer received consent to search the vehicle. During the search, the officer located a Marijuana pipe in the center console and a small baggie of Marijuana in a purse located on the passenger floor board. The passenger (17 years old) admitted to owning the items. The officer confiscated the items. The officer detected an odor of intoxicants on the passenger's breath. The passenger submitted to a PBT with a result of

.09(5). The passenger was arrested and the vehicle was turned over to the driver. The passenger was cited for Possession of Marijuana, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and Minor In Possession. The passenger was held until sober and subsequently posted bond.
