WEEKLY REPORT

April 28 – May 4, 2014

SOLICITORS

On April 28th, at 2:22 p.m., officers were dispatched to the area of Whittaker and Whittaker Court for a report of solicitors. Upon arrival officers located a subject who admitted to soliciting for an area phone company. The subject did not have a permit and was issued a citation as a result and released. The subject had no warrants for his arrest.

LARCENY

On April 28th, at approximately 4:14 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the Ollie's Discount Store on Farmington Road for a report of a larceny. Upon arrival the officer learned from store loss prevention that three to five cardboard bales have been stolen from the alleyway sometime between April 26th and April 28th. The complainant had no suspects.

CIVIL MATTER

On April 29th, at approximately 7:53 p.m., an officer was dispatched to the Los Tres Amigos restaurant for a report of defrauding an innkeeper. Upon arrival the officer learned from the restaurant manager that a customer was unable to pay his bill two days earlier. The manager advised that the man had a bill of approximately \$82 but that his charge card would only accept \$4.32. The waitress charged the \$4.32 to the credit card and the man advised that he would come back the following day to pay the remainder of his bill. When the man failed to show up the second day the manager called police. The incident was forwarded to the Detective Bureau for further investigation.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE

On April 30th, at approximately 10:51 p.m., a resident of Brookdale Condominiums came into this police department to report that she believes that her boyfriend's ex-wife attempted to break into her condominium. The woman reports that she discovered her condominium screen door slightly ajar on today's date and suspects that her boyfriend's ex-wife may have attempted to break into the condominium in order to cause problems between the complainant and her boyfriend. The incident was documented.

OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (OWI)

On May 1st an officer stopped a vehicle on Eight Mile near Farmington Road for speeding.

The driver failed field sobriety tests and was arrested for OWI. A breathalyzer indicated his BAC was .15. The subject was housed and charged with Operating While Intoxicated.

TRESPASSING

On May 2nd, at 8:10 a.m., officers were dispatched to the 22000 block of Farmington Road for a trespassing complaint. The caller stated a white female in her 50's had been sleeping in front of stores in the complex and that she had been warned earlier in the week about trespassing. Upon arrival officers made contact with the female and placed her under arrest for trespassing since she had been warned days earlier. The female was transported to the station where she was processed and housed awaiting arraignment/bond.

IDENTITY THEFT

On May 3rd, at approximately 9:18 p.m., a resident of India came into this police department to report a fraud. The man advised that he is visiting the country for a few weeks and is staying at Drakeshire Apartments. The man checked his credit card online and discovered approximately \$7,000 worth of fraudulent transactions on his account. The man advised that he hasn't used the credit card in the USA and last used the credit card in his home country. The man was advised that the incident will be documented.

FIRE

On May 4th, at approximately 4:10 p.m., officers and Engine 3 responded to the Zap Zone on Grand River Avenue for a report of a fire. Upon arrival officers learned the one of the video games had overheated and caught fire. The fire was extinguished by employees. Officers removed the game to the parking lot and verified that the fire was out.
