## WEEKLY REPORT

June 16 - 22, 2014

### **SOLICITORS**

On June 16<sup>th</sup> officers were dispatched on a report of solicitors in the Warner Farms subdivision. An officer located two subjects who were not observed soliciting. The subjects admitted to selling books and were warned. The subjects left the area.

### **HOUSE FIRE**

On June 16<sup>th</sup> officers and apparatus responded on a reported house fire on Beacon Street. Upon arrival the first officers reported moderate smoke coming from the residence. The homeowner had attempted to put out the fire with a garden hose. Officers located a small fire on the counter in the kitchen next to the stove. The fire was extinguished by officers and minimal damage was sustained to the house.

### **DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED (DWLS)**

On June 16<sup>th</sup>, at 11:14 p.m., a sergeant was conducting stationary radar on Shiawassee at Lakeway. He stopped a vehicle for speeding, 40 mph in a 25 mph zone. Upon checking the driver through LEIN/SOS, it was learned that the driver had a suspended driver's license. The driver was arrested and the vehicle was turned over to a licensed driver. The driver was transported to the Farmington jail where he was processed and released.

### **MISDEMEANOR WARRANT OTHER DEPARTMENT**

On June 19<sup>th</sup> an officer on patrol stopped a commercial vehicle for motor carrier violations. Upon making contact with the driver and passenger, it was found that the passenger had an outstanding warrant out of 16<sup>th</sup> District Court in Livonia for failing to appear on a Possession of Paraphernalia case. The passenger was arrested and subsequently turned over to Livonia police on the warrant.

### **MISDEMEANOR WARRANTS OTHER DEPARTMENT**

On June 19<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 9:17 p.m., an officer stopped a vehicle in the area of Floral and Shiawassee for numerous commercial motor vehicle violations. A check of the passenger revealed two warrants for his arrest for unpaid tickets out of the City of Farmington Hills. The man was arrested on the warrants and was transported to Farmington Hills where he was turned over to their agency.

**OPERATING WHILE INTOXICATED (OWI)**

On June 20<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 3:19 p.m., an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for an improper lane use in the area of Grand River and Halsted. Further investigation revealed that the driver had been drinking alcohol. The driver failed several sobriety exams and was arrested for OWI. The man was transported to the Farmington jail where he submitted to a Datamaster breath test with a result of a .10 BAC. The man was housed at the Farmington jail.

**LARCENY FROM AUTO**

On June 20<sup>th</sup> a resident of Chatham Hills reported her car was broken into the night before. The resident advised she left the vehicle unlocked and \$170 cash was taken from the glove compartment.

**DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED**

On June 20<sup>th</sup> an officer stopped a vehicle on Grand River for a traffic violation. The driver was found to have a suspended license and outstanding warrants. The driver was arrested and transported to this station.

**NEVER ACQUIRED A DRIVER'S LICENSE, MINOR IN POSSESSION (MIP), OPEN INTOXICANTS IN A MOTOR VEHICLE**

On June 21<sup>st</sup> a sergeant stopped a vehicle for speeding on Farmington Road near Cloverdale. When the suspect vehicle stopped, the two front seat passengers quickly switched seats. Upon interviewing the two, it was learned that the teenaged girls were trying to get home from a hotel party in Farmington Hills. The initial driver did not have a driver's license. The second female was intoxicated. The initial driver (who had not been drinking) was arrested for Never Acquired a Driver's License and the second female was arrested for MIP (.13) and Open Intoxicants in a Motor Vehicle. A pint of whiskey was located in her purse. The females were transported to the police station where they were advised to contact their parents.

**DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED**

On June 21<sup>st</sup> an officer stopped a vehicle on Grand River for a traffic violation. The driver was found to have a suspended license and an outstanding warrant. The driver was arrested and transported to this station.

**DRIVING WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED (DWLS)/WARRANTS/POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA**

On June 22<sup>nd</sup>, at 1:17 a.m., an officer observed a vehicle weaving back and forth on westbound M5. The officer stopped the vehicle on Grand River near Middlebelt. The officer checked the driver through LEIN and SOS and learned that he had ten current suspensions on his driver's license and five warrants out of Detroit for traffic offenses. The driver was subsequently arrested. Upon inventory of the vehicle for impound, .3 grams of Marijuana was seized. The driver was lodged in the Farmington jail until he could post bond.

**NOTE:** In addition, dayshift officers responded to five medical runs during this period.
