WEEKLY RECAP

August 10 – August 16, 2015

WARRANTS OTHER POLICE AGENCY

On August 10th at approximately 6:44 PM officers were dispatched to a report of a suspicious male walking down Grand River wearing only hospital scrubs. Upon arrival officers identified the man as a well-known homeless man from the area. Officers were aware that the man had several warrants for his arrest. Officers detained the man and contacted the various departments. All of the other agencies were unable to pick up the man. The man was transported to his family's golf course and released.

LARCENY FROM AUTO

On August 11th at approximately 5:14 AM this department was dispatched to Hawthorne St for a report of suspicious males running through backyards. Upon arrival officers spoke with the complainant who advised that he observed a black male coming from behind a home carrying a trash bag. The complainant confronted the man who took off running with the complainant giving chase. The man met up with another black male who was also carrying a bag. The two dropped the bags and took off running from the complainant. The complainant flagged down a Farmington Hills police officer who was able to stop the two suspects. Officers located the bags and learned that the two suspects had been breaking into cars in both the City and the Hills. The suspects admitted to stealing from 15 unlocked vehicles in both cities. The two were arrested and are being charged with the larcenies.

DOG BITE

On August 11th at approximately 11:03 AM officers were dispatched to the 32700 block of Grand River for a report of a dog bite. Upon arrival officers learned that the victim had been walking his dog in the area when a German Shepherd got off his leash and attempted to attack the victim's dog. The victim ended up getting bit by the German shepherd in the process of trying to rescue his dog. The victim's injuries were treated and the owner of the German shepherd was cited for failing to control his dog.

LARCENY OF BICYCLE

On August 11th at approximately 2PM a 13 year old resident came into the police department to report that his bicycle had been stolen while he was downtown. The teen advised that he

had parked his bicycle unlocked in the downtown area and when he returned two hours later it was gone. The victim has no idea who stole his bicycle.

NEVER ACQUIRED DRIVER'S LICENSE

On August 12th at approximately 3:34 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Orchard Lake for speeding. Further investigation revealed that the driver did not have a driver's license and had two warrants for her arrest. The driver was arrested for never acquiring a driver's license and was housed at the Farmington Jail.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On August 12th at approximately 8:57 PM a sergeant on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Mooney for a defective equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver had 16 suspensions on his driver's license and had several warrants for his arrest. A subsequent consent search of the driver's vehicle revealed .5 grams of Marijuana. The driver was arrested for being in possession of marijuana and for driving on a suspended license. The driver was housed at the Farmington Jail.

SOLICITING WITHOUT A PERMIT

On August 13th at approximately 2:11 PM an officer was dispatched to the area of 22800 Hayden for a report of subjects going door to door selling vacuums. Upon arrival the officer located the subjects who were working for Kirby Vacuum. The subjects did not have a permit to solicit with in the city of Farmington and they were cited.

BRUSH FIRE

On August 14th at approximately 4:20 PM officers were dispatched to a fire alarm at a business on the 24000 block of Drake Rd. Upon arrival officers learned from staff that the alarm was triggered by an outside bush that had been on fire. Officers noted that the bush was out prior to officers' arrival.

ODOR INVESTIGATION

On August 14th at approximately 5:59 PM officers were dispatched to an odor of propane at a business on the 34000 block of Nine Mile. Upon arrival officers searched the building but could not find any odor of propane.

SOLICITOR

On August 14th at approximately 7:52 PM officers were dispatched to a report of a solicitor on Briar Ridge and Smithfield. Upon arrival officers located the solicitor who had a valid permit out of the City of Farmington Hills. The man was educated on city boundaries and sent back to the City of Farmington Hills.

OPERATE WHILE UNDER INFLUENCE OF DRUGS

On August 14th at approximately 9:51 PM an officer on patrol observed a vehicle disobey the red light at Farmington Rd and Freedom Rd. The officer attempted to stop the vehicle by using overhead lights and audible siren as they headed west on Freedom Rd. A second officer joined the pursuit as the suspect vehicle failed to stop for the two police vehicles. At Grand River the vehicle stopped for the red light and was boxed in by both officers. The

driver exhibited signs of intoxication and admitted to being under the influence of Zoloft. The driver was arrested for operating under the influence of drugs. The driver submitted to a blood test and was released pending a warrant from the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office.

MINOR HAVING CONSUMED ALCOHOL

On August 15th at approximately 2AM officers were dispatched to a gas station in the 35000 block of Grand River for a report of several minors partying in the parking lot. Upon arrival officers located 6 females under the age of 21 standing around 2 vehicles with a bottle of vodka. The females advised that they were at an underage party in a different city that had been broken up and that they were now going to party in the gas station parking lot. 3 of the 6 females failed preliminary breath tests and were cited for having consumed alcohol while underage, the other 3 were sober and had not been drinking. The females were released on scene and their vodka destroyed.

LARCENY

On August 15th an officer was dispatched to the 31000 block of Shiawassee for a report of a stolen chair. Upon arrival the officer learned from the victim that he had placed a folding outdoor chair near the front of his house the night before and now the chair was missing. The man has no suspects.

CIVIL MATTER

On August 15th at approximately 5:21 PM an officer was dispatched to a pawn shop on the 30900 block of Grand River for a report of a possible larceny. Upon arrival the officer learned from the store owner that a customer had come into the store asking about the price of a coffee table that was displayed for sale outside the store. The owner told the customer that the table was \$5. The customer paid the \$5 and left. Later the owner realized that the man had taken a different table that was actually worth \$50 and that the \$5 was still on premises. The owner was advised that the issue was not a larceny since the owner did not clarify with the customer which table he was talking about. The owner was advised to pursue civil litigation for the cost of the table.

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA

On August 15th at approximately 8:54 PM officers were dispatched to the 22700 block of Hawthorne for a report of a noise complaint. Upon arrival officers located the loud subjects sitting on a truck that had been parked on the lawn of the residence. As officers approached they noticed two bags of marijuana on the lift gate of the truck. The owner of the 9 grams of marijuana was arrested for being in possession of marijuana and was housed at the Farmington Jail.

OPERATE WITH HIGH BAC

On August 15th at approximately 10:08 PM a Commander and an FHPD officer stopped a vehicle in the area of Shiawassee and Power for driving on a flat tire. Further investigation revealed that the driver exhibited signs of intoxication. The driver failed several sobriety exams and was arrested for operating while intoxicated. The driver was transported to the Farmington Jail where she submitted to a Datamaster Breath Test with a result of a .20 BAC. The driver was housed at the Farmington Jail.

OPERATE WHILE INTOXICATED

On August 16th at approximately 1AM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Farmington Rd and Shiawassee for an improper lane use violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver exhibited signs of intoxication and admitted to drinking at a bar in Novi. The driver failed several sobriety exams and was arrested for operating while intoxicated. A check of the driver revealed four warrants for her arrest and that she had a suspended license. The driver was transported to the Farmington Jail where she submitted to a Datamaster Breath Test with a result of a .12 BAC. The driver was housed at the Farmington Jail.

MINOR HAVING CONSUMED ALCOHOL

On August 16th at approximately 1:18 AM officers were dispatched to a loud party at a swim club on the 33000 block of Freedom Rd. Upon arrival officers looked through the fence of the club and observed several underage minors running away from the pool area. Officers jumped the fence and caught one of the teens hiding in the bushes. The teen advised that the teens were all employees of the club and that they were having an underage drinking party after hours. The teen admitted that none of the teens had permission to be at the club after hours. Officers located one more underage minor at a neighboring condo complex who also admitted to drinking. Both minors submitted to preliminary breath tests and were cited for consuming alcohol underage. Management of the club was contacted and informed of the incident.

DISORDERLY INTOXICATION

On August 16th at approximately 1:48 AM officers were dispatched to the 22000 block of Maple for a report of a disorderly subject banging on the complainant's door. Upon arrival officers located the subject who was heavily intoxicated. Officers learned from the complainant that she used to date the subject several months ago but that the relationship had ended due to violence. The subject showed up at the complainant's house on this night and began banging on the door while yelling profanities at the house. The man was arrested for disorderly intoxication and his car was impounded because he had parked it in the complainant's driveway. The man was housed at the Farmington Jail until sober.

OPERATE WITH HIGH BAC

On August 16th at approximately 6:33 PM officers were dispatched to a home on the 23000 block of Longacre for a welfare check of the homeowner. Officers learned from dispatch that a friend of the homeowner called dispatch advising that she was concerned that her friend may be in danger from her husband. As officers were knocking on the door the homeowner and her husband drove their car onto the driveway. Officers spoke with the wife, who had been driving, and noted that she exhibited signs of intoxication. The woman failed several sobriety exams and was arrested for operating while intoxicated. The woman was transported to the Farmington Jail where she submitted to a Datamaster Breath Test with a result of a .36 BAC. The woman was housed at the Farmington Jail.

MISDEMEANOR WARRANT THIS POLICE AGENCY

While performing the welfare check at the above Longacre address officers learned that the husband of the homeowner had a warrant for his arrest for assault out of this police department. The man was arrested for the warrant and housed at the Farmington Jail.

Note: Officers had responded to 15 medical calls this week and 5 traffic crashes.
