## **WEEKLY RECAP**

**September 28 – October 4, 2015**

### **DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED**

On September 28<sup>th</sup> at approximately 8:06 AM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Power for speeding. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license. The driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license and was processed at the Farmington Jail. The driver was released with a citation.

### **DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED**

On September 29<sup>th</sup> at approximately 3:42 AM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Farmington for disobeying the no turn on red sign. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license and two warrants for his arrest. The driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license and was housed at the Farmington Jail.

### **LARCENY IN A BUILDING**

On September 30<sup>th</sup> a student at the Farmington High School reported that his cell phone was stolen while left unattended during a physical education class. Further investigation revealed that a fellow student was in possession of the stolen phone and had contradictory versions of how he came into possession of the stolen phone. The suspect was arrested for being in possession of the stolen phone and was turned over to his parent.

### **OPERATE UNDER INFLUENCE OF NARCOTICS**

On September 30<sup>th</sup> at approximately 11:46 AM an off-duty fire reserve observed a vehicle driving in the area of Grand River and Orchard Lake in a reckless manner. The fire reserve reported the reckless driver via 9-1-1 and two officers got behind the vehicle in the area of Grand River and Power. Officers noted that the vehicle was still driving recklessly. The vehicle was stopped and a subsequent investigation revealed that the driver was under the influence of pain killers. The driver failed several sobriety exams and was arrested for driving under the influence of narcotics. The driver was housed at the Farmington Jail.

### **ATTEMPT FRAUD**

On September 30<sup>th</sup> a Riverglen Resident came into the police department to report that he had received a check for over \$2,000 in the mail from an unknown company. The letter attached to the check advised that the complainant was to contact a representative from the company on how to use the money. The complainant immediately recognized the check as a scam and decided to report the incident.

### **SOLICITORS**

On October 1<sup>st</sup> at approximately 12:49 PM an officer on patrol observed a man conducting door to door sales for a company called "The Experience LLC" in the area of Merrilyn Ct. The man was unable to produce a solicitor's permit and was cited for soliciting without a permit.

### **SOLICITORS**

On October 1<sup>st</sup> at approximately 1:17 PM an officer was dispatched to a report of a solicitor in the area of Vicary and Brittany Hill. The officer located the man, who was conducting door to door sales for "The Experience LLC". A LEIN check of the man revealed that he had several warrant for his arrest out of Florida and nearby cities for soliciting without a permit and minor in possession of alcohol. The man was arrested on the warrants and housed at the Farmington jail. The man was cited for soliciting without a permit.

### **LARCENY IN A BUILDING**

On October 1<sup>st</sup> at approximately 5:49 PM a Maple Ave resident came into the public safety department to report that someone had stolen his wallet at a coffee shop in the 33000 block of Grand River. The man advised that he had accidentally left his wallet at the coffee shop and when he returned it was missing. When the man returned to his home on Maple Ave he noticed that his wallet was placed in his mailbox. The man noticed that his cash and gift cards were missing from his wallet. The man does not know who stole the money or who returned his wallet to him.

### **OPERATE WITH HIGH BLOOD ALCOHOL CONTENT**

On October 1<sup>st</sup> at approximately 10:51 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Farmington Rd for driving on the curb and an improper lane use violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver exhibited signs of intoxication. The driver failed several sobriety exams and was arrested for operating while intoxicated. The driver was housed at the Farmington Jail and submitted to a Datamaster Breath Test with a result of a .23 BAC.

### **MISDEMEANOR WARRANT OTHER POLICE AGENCY**

On October 2<sup>nd</sup> at approximately 1:40 AM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Farmington and Alta Loma for having a defective brake light. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a warrant for his arrest out of a nearby police agency. The other agency was unable to pick up the driver so he was advised of his warrant and released.

### **OPERATE WHILE INTOXICATED**

On October 3<sup>rd</sup> at approximately 2:10 AM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Nine Mile and Farmington Rd for speeding. Further investigation revealed that the driver exhibited signs of intoxication. The driver failed several sobriety exams and was arrested for

operating while intoxicated. The driver refused to take a Datamaster Breath Test so a search warrant for his blood was obtained. The driver was housed at the Farmington Jail.

**DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED**

On October 3<sup>rd</sup> at approximately 12:24 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Hawthorne for having an improper plate violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license and that the passenger had a warrant for his arrest out of a nearby police agency. The driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license and the passenger was advised and released on his warrant because the other police agency was unable to pick him up. The driver was processed at the Farmington Jail and released with a citation.

Note: Officers had responded to 18 medical calls this week and 3 traffic crashes.
