WEEKLY RECAP

October 26 – November 1, 2015

POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA PARAPHERNALIA

On October 26th at approximately 1:30 AM a Commander on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Grove for speeding. Upon approaching the driver, the Commander noted that there was a marijuana water bong on the floor board between the driver's feet. Further investigation revealed a marijuana grinder inside the vehicle and a LEIN check of the driver revealed that he had a suspended driver's license and a warrant for his arrest out of another police agency. The driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license and for being in possession of paraphernalia. The driver was housed at the Farmington Jail.

FALSE ID TO POLICE OFFICER

On October 26th at approximately 11:07 AM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Shiawassee and Orchard Lake for speeding. The officer interviewed the driver who did not have his driver's license on his person. The driver gave his name to the officer but when the officer retrieved the driver's license photo associated with the name provided the officer noted that it was a different person. The officer confronted the driver and driver advised that he had lied and given his brother's name. The driver gave another name, but that too was false. The driver was arrested for providing false information to a police officer. Subsequent investigation revealed the driver's true name and that he had a suspended license and warrants for his arrest. The driver was housed at the Farmington Jail.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On October 26th at approximately 4:57 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Farmington for speeding. Further investigation revealed that the driver has a suspended driver's license. The driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license and was processed at the Farmington Jail. The driver was released with a citation.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On October 27th at approximately 9:06 AM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Whitaker and Oakland for having an expired license plate. Subsequent investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license. The driver was arrested for driving on a

suspended license and was processed at the Farmington Jail. The driver was released with a citation.

NEVER ACQUIRED DRIVER'S LICENSE

On October 27th at approximately 3:21 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle on M-5 Expressway near Farmington Rd for driving with an expire license plate. Further investigation revealed that the driver had never obtained a driver's license. The driver was arrested for driving without a license and was processed at the Farmington Jail. The driver was released with a citation.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On October 27th at approximately 7:15 PM a Sergeant on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Hawthorne for driving with an expired license plate. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended driver's license. The driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license and was processed at the Farmington Jail. The driver was released with a citation.

ARCING WIRES

On October 28th at approximately 1:54 AM officers were dispatched to a report of electrical wires arcing behind a house on Colchester St. Upon arrival officers secured the area and turned the scene over to DTE Energy.

ASSIST CITIZEN

On October 28th at approximately 5:58 PM officers assisted a Mayfield resident in removing a bird from her home.

MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

On October 28th at approximately 6:58 PM a Brittany Hill Ct resident came into the public safety department to report damage done to his truck. The resident advised that he had parked his truck on the street in front of his parent's home and when he returned to his truck a few days later he discovered burn marks on his hard tonneau cover. The resident brought in the burnt towel that he found on the cover that had caused the damage. The resident has no suspects.

MISDEMEANOR WARRANT OTHER POLICE AGENCY

On October 29th at approximately 8:22 AM a Sergeant on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Shiawassee and Prospect for speeding. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a warrant for her arrest out of another police agency. The warrant was confirmed but the other agency was unable to pick her up. The driver was advised of her warrant and released.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On October 30th at approximately 1:04 AM an Officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Drake for an equipment violation. Further investigation revealed that that driver had a suspended driver's license and 6 warrants for his arrest. The driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license and was housed at the Farmington Jail.

UTTERING AND PUBLISHING

On October 30th at approximately 2:03 PM Officers were dispatched to a report of a suspect attempting to cash a \$4,200 fraudulent check at a bank on the 33200 block of Grand River Ave. Upon arrival a Sergeant and a FHPD Officer witnessed the suspect exit the front doors of the bank. The officers confronted the suspect and he took off running east on Grand River Ave. Officers gave chase to the suspect and a third officer cornered him in front of a nearby business. The suspect was arrested for uttering and publishing and was housed at the Farmington Jail.

OPEN INTOX MOTOR VEHICLE

On October 31st at approximately 1:30 AM officers were dispatched to a condo complex on the 32000 block of Grand River for a loud music complaint. Upon arrival officers observed a vehicle parked in a parking spot and an inebriated passenger exit the vehicle. Officers investigated and noted that both the driver and the passenger had been drinking. The driver passed sobriety exams, but the passenger had been drinking whiskey while inside the car. The passenger was cited for having an open bottle of liquor in a motor vehicle.

SOLICITORS

On October 31st at approximately 11:59 AM an Officer was dispatched to a report of a door to door salesman in the area of Vicary and Brittany Hill. Upon arrival the officer located the man who was soliciting for Power Home Remodeling. The solicitor did not have a Farmington Permit and was cited for soliciting without a permit.

ASSIST OTHER POLICE AGENCY

On October 31st at approximately 5:27 PM this department was contacted by the Clawson Police Department with a request to check a vehicle registered to Farmington address that may have been involved in a hit and run accident. An officer located the vehicle and verified that the vehicle was not involved in the accident.

OPERATE WHILE INTOXICATED 2ND OFFENSE

On November 1st at approximately 1:30 AM an Officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Farmington Rd and Oakland for driving southbound in the northbound lanes. Subsequent investigation revealed that driver exhibited signs of intoxication. The driver failed several sobriety exams and was arrested for operating while intoxicated. The driver refused to take a Datamaster breath test so a search warrant was obtained for the driver's blood. The driver has a previous conviction for operating while intoxicated and was housed at the Farmington Jail until sober.

MALICIOUS DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

On November 1st at approximately 8:10 AM an officer was dispatched to a report of a broken car window at a residence on Vicary Ln. Upon arrival the officer learned from the victim that both of his rear passenger windows on his vehicle, as well as one of his parent's vehicle's windows, were smashed overnight. The victim had no suspects.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On November 1st at approximately 12:28 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for having an expired license plate in the area of Nine Mile and Farmington Rd. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license and 2 warrants for his arrest. The driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license and housed at the Farmington Jail.

FRAUD

On November 1st an Alta Loma resident came into the public safety department to report that he was the victim of a fraud. The resident advised that he had found a vehicle for sale on Craigslist.org and contacted the owner to purchase. The owner sent the resident a link to an eBay motors site that advised the resident on how to purchase the vehicle. The resident placed a \$2,500 deposit and was told that the vehicle was being shipped to him. The resident was then sent another email requesting that he pay the remainder of the sale. The resident became suspicious and contacted eBay from contact information at their website. The resident learned that the vehicle was never listed with eBay and that no sale had ever gone through their site. He further learned that the email sent to him was not from a real eBay website. Further investigation revealed that the vehicle owner was a known scammer online. The case was forwarded to the Detective Bureau for further investigation.

JUVENILE COMPLAINT

On November 1st at approximately 2:11 PM officers were dispatched to a business on the 31500 block of Grand River for a report of 4 juveniles throwing rocks at a garage door. Upon arrival an officer located the 4 juveniles at a nearby restaurant while another officer interviewed the business owner. The business owner advised that he witnessed the juveniles throwing rocks at his business garage door. The business owner did not want to prosecute the juveniles but wanted them issued a no trespass order for his business. The juveniles were turned over to their parents and advised to never return to the business.

JUVENILE MISCHIEF

On November 1st at approximately 7:45 PM officers were dispatched to a report of juveniles TP'ing (toilet papering) a residence on Violet St. Upon arrival officers spoke with the homeowner (who was not the complainant) who advised that the TP to her home was done by her grandchildren and that her grandchildren pull the same prank every year. The homeowner did not want a report filed.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On November 1st at approximately 10:11 PM an Officer on patrol stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Grove for speeding. A subsequent investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license and several warrants for her arrest. In addition, the passenger of the vehicle had a warrant for her arrest out of the City of Farmington Hills. The driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license and was housed at the Farmington Jail. The passenger was turned over to the Farmington Hills Police.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On November 1st at approximately 10:37 PM the arrested person from the above DWLS arrest was allowed to contact someone to pick up her car. Shortly thereafter a friend of the arrested drove up to the incident and advised that he would take custody of the vehicle. The

man parked his car while officers conducted a routine check of the man's license to ensure that he is able to legally drive the arrestee's vehicle away. The LEIN check revealed that the man had a suspended driver's license and two warrants for his arrest. The man was arrested for driving on a suspended license and was housed at the Farmington Jail.

Note: Officers had responded to 12 medical calls this week and 2 traffic crashes.
