WEEKLY RECAP

December 28, 2015 – January 3, 2016

PROVIDE FALSE ID TO POLICE OFFICER

On December 28th at approximately 12:42 AM officers were dispatched to a report of two suspicious persons walking around a condo complex on the 32700 block of Grand River. Upon arrival officers located a male and a female matching the suspect's descriptions sitting in a van in the parking lot. The couple advised that they were looking for a friend's condo, but could not say who the friend was or where the friend lived. The male provided officers with a name which was different from the name that the female gave for the male. It was later learned that the male and female are siblings and that the name that the female gave for the male had several warrants for his arrest. The male admitted that he lied regarding his identity and was arrested. The man was housed at the Farmington Jail.

SOLICITOR

On December 28th at approximately 11:07 AM officers were dispatched to a report of two solicitors going door to door at a condominium complex on the 23000 block of Farmington Rd. Upon arrival officers located the two men who were soliciting for "First Home Improvement". Neither men had a City of Farmington solicitor permit so both were cited for soliciting without a permit.

ACCIDENTAL PROPERTY DAMAGE

On December 28th at approximately 4:57 PM an officer was dispatched to a business on the 24000 block of Orchard Lake for a report of damaged property. Upon arrival the officer learned from the victim that a business sign had blown off of the building due to high winds and landed on his vehicle, breaking the rear window. A report was taken to document the damage.

HARASSING PHONE CALLS

On December 28th at approximately 5:50 PM a Farmington resident came into the public safety department to report that she has been receiving phone calls and text messages from a man that she had met at an Ann Arbor Bar. The resident advised that she told the man several times that she did not want to date him, but that he continues to text. The man was

called by officers and advised that he will be arrested for stalking should he continue to call the resident.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On December 28th at approximately 7:16 PM an officer stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River and Nine Mile for driving without headlights on. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license and warrants for her arrest out of nearby police agencies. The driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license and housed at the Farmington Jail.

DROVE WHILE LICENSE SUSPENDED

On December 29th at approximately 7:59 PM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for a vision obstruction in the area of Grand River and Drake. Further investigation revealed that the driver had a suspended license. The driver was arrested for driving on the suspended license and was processed at the Farmington Jail. The driver was released with a citation.

OPERATE WHILE INTOXICATED

On December 30th at approximately 1:51 AM an officer on patrol stopped a vehicle for erratic driving in the area of Drake and Lark Harbor. Further investigation revealed that the driver exhibited signs of intoxication and admitted to drinking. The driver failed several sobriety exams and was subsequently arrested for operating while intoxicated. The driver submitted to a preliminary breath test on the scene with a result of a .11 BAC. The driver refused to take a Datamaster breath test and therefore a warrant was sought for her blood. The driver was housed at the Farmington Jail.

IDENTITY THEFT

On December 30th a Farmington resident reported an identity theft at the public safety front desk. The victim reports that someone had overdrawn his checking account over \$500. The case was forwarded to the detective bureau for further investigation.

SUSPICIOUS CIRCUMSTANCE

On December 30th at approximately 1:39 PM an officer was dispatched to a report of suspicious damage to a garage door at a residence on Floral St. Upon arrival the officer spoke with the complainant who advised that she noticed for the last 5 to 6 weeks she has been having trouble closing her garage door. Further inspection showed that someone had apparently pulled on the garage door causing damage.

PROBATION VIOLATION

On December 30th at approximately 10:33 PM a Prospect St resident attempted to report her 26 year old son as a missing person. Officers further learned that the 26 year old son had left his mother's residence on Prospect St in a highly intoxicated state. The complainant was concerned because her son had left wearing shorts, a t-shirt, and no shoes. The son was located at the Shiawassee Park and exhibited signs of intoxication. The son is on probation with the 47th District Court for OWI and is ordered to abstain from alcohol. The son submitted to a Preliminary Breath Test with a result of .20 BAC. A copy of the probation violation was forwarded to the probation department.

FUEL SPILL

On January 1st at approximately 11:28 AM a Commander on patrol observed a snow plow leaking diesel fuel onto the street at State and Liberty St. Further investigation revealed that the owner of the vehicle had just plowed and salted a nearby business parking lot when he noticed that diesel was leaking from an external gas tank. Approximately 10-15 gallons of fuel leaked onto the roadway. Officers prevented the diesel from entering the water system by administering dry sorb to the fuel. Farmington Department of Public Works was called in to clean the spill and the owner of the vehicle was cited for spilling the fuel onto the roadway.

CARBON MONOXIDE ALARM

On January 1st at approximately 8:10 PM officers were dispatched to a report of a carbon monoxide alarm activation at a home on Lee Lane. Upon arrival officers checked the home for Carbon Monoxide and found no excessive levels. It was determined that the alarm activation was a low battery alarm.

COMMITMENT DAY 5K RUN

On January 1st at 10 AM officers assisted Lifetime Fitness in blocking traffic while they conducted their 3rd annual Commitment Day 5k Run.
