WEEKLY RECAP

May 30, 2016 – June 5, 2016

Drug Paraphernalia

On May 31st an Officer stopped a vehicle in the area of Grand River Ave and Drake. A roadside field investigation was conducted and a K-9 was requested to conduct a sniff of the vehicle. The investigation revealed that the driver was in possession of drug/narcotic paraphernalia as well as a number of pills that the subject admitted to purchasing from a friend. The subject was issued a citation and the pills sent to the laboratory for analysis.

Burglary / Non-Residence

On May 31st an Officer responded to the Freedom Plaza construction site at Grand River Ave near Halsted for a report of a B&E and theft of construction equipment. It was learned that the construction trailers that were attacked had been blocked in by a CAT Wheel Loader and CAT Crane that had been moved by unknown subject(s). The case was turned over to Investigators. The investigation is ongoing.

Fraud – Illegal Use of Credit Card

On June 1st a Farmington resident report that their credit card was used to make an unauthorized purchase at a gas station in St. Clair Shores. Investigators are currently working with the Bank in an attempt to identify suspect(s).

Larceny

On June 2nd a Farmington resident, as a result of the NIXLE alert about larceny from automobiles, reported that two bicycles were stolen from an open garage.

Customer Trouble

On June 2nd Officers responded to Advance America for a disruptive customer. The customer was advised that they were not welcome back at the branch and if they had a dispute they must dispute the matter in a civil court proceeding.

Drug Paraphernalia

On June 3rd an Officer made contact with two subjects on foot in the area of Hawthorne and Grand River Ave. The two subjects were determined to be highly intoxicated and employees of local business where they had been drinking and using drugs. One subject was issued a citation for drug paraphernalia and CEMS Paramedics responded to evaluate their physical well-being.
