### SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

#### Fraud

On January 4<sup>th</sup> a Shiawassee Ave resident reported that she was the victim of an online scam to the police front desk. The victim advised the officer that she had received an email from someone that she thought was Netflix. The victim provided her personal information and credit card to the unknown suspect and since then she has had several fraudulent accounts opened in her name.

#### Broken Window

On January 4<sup>th</sup> an officer responded to a residence on Cloverdale St. for a report of a smashed car window. Upon arrival the officer learned that the victim had discovered that sometime over the previous few days and unknown person had smashed the passenger side window. The victim believes that the suspect had intended to steal the 2019 Dodge Challenger, but that the suspect didn't know that the vehicle has a dead battery.

#### Larceny in a Building

On January 6<sup>th</sup> an officer responded to the AT&T store on Grand River Ave for a larceny in a building. Upon arrival the officer spoke with the victim who is a sales person at the store. The victim advised that he was helping two customers open an account and when he went into the back room to retrieve some items, the two left the store with the victim's personal cell phone as well as a store phone. Video surveillance shows two males steal the phones and escape in a older model blue Chevrolet Impala. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau.

#### Malicious Damage to Property

On January 6<sup>th</sup> an officer responded to the Sunoco Gas Station on Eight Mile Rd. for a report of a smashed window. Upon arrival the officer learned from the business owner that sometime overnight,

an unknown person had struck the front glass door resulting in a large spider web crack. The owner has no suspects and the incident was documented.

**Larceny from Auto**

On January 7<sup>th</sup> a Wilmarth resident reported that an unknown person stole money from his vehicle's center console sometime overnight. The victim believes that his vehicle was locked and has no suspects. On the same day officers learned that an unlocked vehicle was entered on Oakland St. and another was entered on Macomb St. Items were stolen from both cars.

**Larceny**

On January 7<sup>th</sup> officers responded to the Shell Gas Station on Grand River Ave for a report of a larceny. Upon arrival officers learned from the victim that he had arranged to purchase 4 iPhones from a subject from Facebook Marketplace. The victim and the suspect agreed to meet in public at the gas station and to use a middleman to conduct the transaction. The victim gave the middleman the money for the iPhones, but the suspect drove away with the cash. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

**Larceny from Auto**

On January 9<sup>th</sup> an officer responded to the Valley View Condominium complex for a report of a larceny from auto. Upon arrival the officer learned from the victim that sometime overnight an unknown suspect entered the victim's unlocked vehicle and stole cash from a purse. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.
