SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

GAS LEAK:

On July 26th at approximately 2:00 AM, officers responded to 23000 block of Violet Street on a report of a large gas leak. Area residents were evacuated safely until the leak was fixed by Consumers. The investigation revealed the leak was a result of a gas line that was struck by a resident who was digging late the previous night with a shovel.

OPEN BUILDING:

On July 27th, at approximately 3:30 AM, an officer was conducting a foot patrol in the downtown business area and located an open door. The interior of the business was checked by officers and the door was secured prior to leaving.

CHECK FRAUD:

On July 28th, a representative of Credit Union One reported that a fraudulent business check was presented by a black male subject who attempted to cash the check. The subject was not identified and left prior to police arrival. The bank chose not to pursue any charges.

FRAUD:

On July 29th, a Roseville resident reported that their debit card was fraudulently used to withdraw money by an unknown suspect though an ATM located at the 7-11 on Grand River in the city of Farmington.

UDAA:

On July 30th, a resident from Kensington Manor Apartments reported that their 2011 Jeep Cherokee was stolen overnight. The stolen vehicle was located by a Farmington Officer, shortly after being stolen; however, the suspect driver fled at a high rate of speed. Due to the safety of the public, the stolen vehicle was not pursued.



INJURY ACCIDENT:

On July 30th, Officers responded to the area of Grand River and Orchard Court on a report of an automobile vs bicycle accident. The bicyclist was treated and transported to a local hospital for minor injuries.

INJURY ACCIDENT:

On July 30th, Officers responded to the area of Orchard Lake and Shiawassee Rd on a report of an injury accident. Both drivers were treated on scene for minor injuries.

LARCENY FROM AUTO:

On July 31st, a resident from Versailles Condos reported that tools were stolen from inside his vehicle overnight. The owner of the vehicle reported that he recalled seeing two suspicious vehicles parked near his vehicle the night prior; however, he was unsure if the vehicle were related to this incident. The vehicle was processed for fingerprints by officers on scene.
