### SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

#### Trespass

On June 8<sup>th</sup> officers responded to the Starbucks on Grand River Ave for a report of a disorderly customer. Upon arrival officers learned from management that the customer became upset when an employee mispronounced his name when calling the customer's order. The customer began yelling and screaming at the staff over the way he perceived he was treated so the manager asked the customer to leave. The customer refused to leave so management called police.

Officers spoke with the man and advised him that management wanted him to leave. The man refused and continued his yelling behavior. After officers attempted several times to convince the customer to leave, he was arrested for trespassing. The customer was driven to the police department where he was released with a citation.

#### Smoke Investigation

On June 9<sup>th</sup> officers and Engine 1 responded to the 32700 block of Laurelwood Ct for smoke in a building. Upon arrival, officers located the source of the smoke to be from the next door neighbor's campfire. No dangers were located at the home.

#### Catalytic Convertor Theft

On June 10<sup>th</sup> a Jamestown Apartment resident reported to police that someone had stolen his catalytic convertor off of his 2001 Honda Odyssey. The victim does not know who stole the automobile part and the report was forwarded to the detective bureau for further investigation.

#### Trespass

On June 11<sup>th</sup> officers responded to the 1Up Barcade on Grand River Ave for a report of a disorderly female yelling at the other customers. Upon arrival officers located the female who initially refused to leave, but complied once officers threatened to arrest her. The woman was issued a "no trespass" order for 1Up and the Basement Burger Bar.

Officers advised the woman several times that she needed to leave or she would be arrested for trespassing. The woman refused to leave and berated the officers instead. The woman was arrested for trespassing and was released at her home with a citation.
