SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

Identity Theft

On March 28th a Drakeshire Apartment resident reported at the police front desk that she had been contacted by her credit union and advised that an unknown person had withdrawn money from her account. The complainant advised that \$1,000 had been withdrawn via CashApp, a money transfer phone application. The report was filed by the officer.

Larceny from Auto

On March 28th at approximately 4AM a Kensington Manor Apartment resident witnessed a male teenager break the window of a vehicle parked in the parking lot and remove items from inside. The witness called the police after the suspect climbed into a white Dodge Journey and fled the scene. Officers arrived on scene and discovered 2 other vehicles that had been attacked. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Flee and Elude

On March 30th a Sergeant on patrol attempted to stop a black Nissan for speeding in the area of Grand River Ave and Lakeway. The Nissan failed to stop for the officer and accelerated to over 81 mph while disobeying red lights. The pursuit was terminated due to traffic safety concerns and the report was forwarded to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Fraud

On April 1st a Mayfield St. resident came into the police department to report that she had been the victim of a fraud. The resident advised that she had received a phone call from a man who claimed to be from DTE Energy. The phone number that showed up on her caller ID was a number that was registered to DTE Energy, later revealed to be a spoofed number. The caller convinced the victim that she was behind in her electrical payments and that she needed to pay DTE Energy through a Zelle app on her phone. The victim paid the man over \$500 through the app before realizing that she had been scammed. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau.
