SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

Larceny

On May 30th at approximately 3:30 AM an officer on patrol witnessed a man walking down Shiawassee and Hillcrest pulling a Waste Management garbage can. The officer conducted a consent interview with the man and discovered that he had several industrial sized electrical wiring. The man advised that he had gone through area dumpsters and was scrapping for metal. The officer had previous contact with the man and knew that he had been investigated for stealing copper off of air conditioning units in years past. Other officers checked the local businesses but were unable to locate where the wires came from. The man allowed the officer to take the garbage can and wires until it could be determined where the wires came from.

The following day, the officer stopped by a construction site and showed photos of the wires to local contractors. The contractors advised the officer that the wires are typically used for industrial sized generators. The officer went to the closest industrial generator to where the man was seen with the garbage can and discovered that the Mediloge Nursing Home generator had all the electrical wires removed. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Fraud

On June 2nd an Oakland Ave resident reported at the front desk that he was the victim of a fraud. The victim advised that he had been searching online for investment opportunities when he came across an individual who was selling shares of stock for a mining company. The victim corresponded with the suspect and eventually transferred over \$7,000 worth of cash to an online account. The victim later learned that the man was scamming him out of his money. The incident was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

Carrying a Concealed Pistol

On June 5th officers responded to the Wendy's restaurant on Orchard Lake Rd. for a report of a man in the drive thru wearing a mask and with a gun. Officers learned enroute that the man did not threaten

anyone with the firearm or point it at anyone. As officers were arriving, they witnessed the man speed away from the business and duck into the subdivision across the street. An officer effected a traffic stop on the suspect and the man denied going to the Wendy's drive up window. The officer noted that the man had a Wendy's Frosty in his cupholder so he was removed from the vehicle. A search of the vehicle revealed the man's mask and a loaded 9mm pistol. The search also revealed a stolen wallet, two counterfeit bills, and some cocaine. The man was arrested and charged.
