### SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

#### LARCENY FROM AUTO/ASSIST OTHER POLICE AGENCY:

On September 6th, at approximately 5:00 AM, an officer was conducting an area patrol near the intersection of Hawthorne Street and Astor Street. During the patrol, the officer located a Dodge Ram Pick-up missing rims and tires. An investigation revealed that the vehicle was pushed from 31000 block of Fink in Farmington Hills to the 22000 block of Hawthorne where the rims and tires were stolen from the vehicle. The incident was turned over to Farmington Hills Police for further investigation.

#### LARCENY FROM AUTO:

On September 6<sup>th</sup> at approximately 7:00 AM, officers responded to 22000 block of Violet Street on a report of a larceny from auto. A resident reported that items were moved all throughout the inside of her unlocked vehicle; however, it was further reported that no items were missing. A report was taken for documentation and residents were reminded to keep vehicle doors locked while unattended or overnight.

#### CHECK FRAUD:

On September 7th, a representative of Credit Union One reported that a fraudulent business check was presented by a black male subject who attempted to cash the check. The suspect was identified as a 56-year-old resident of Detroit. The case was turned over to the detective bureau for further investigation.

#### FRAUD/SWINDLE:

On September 8<sup>th</sup> at approximately 10:00 AM, a Farmington resident reported they were a victim of fraud. The victim advised she received an email from a person she believed was her employer. The email requested her phone number and upon providing her phone number, she received a text requesting she purchase \$600 in various gift cards for employees of the

company. The email further stated that she would be reimbursed for the purchase of the gift cards. The victim then provided the information from the gift cards to the unknown suspect. Upon returning to work, she learned that a fraudulent email was created in her employer's name and the balance on the gift cards was now gone.

**CHECK FRAUD:**

On September 9th, a representative from Flagstar Bank reported that a black male was at the location attempting to cash a fraudulent check. Investigation revealed that the suspect was a 56-year-old male resident of Detroit. The suspect was arrested and released pending charges from the Oakland County Prosecutor Office.

**ATTEMPTED UDAA:**

On September 11<sup>th</sup> at approximately 12:00 AM, Officers responded to Drakeshire Apartments on a report of a larceny from auto. Investigation conducted by responding officers revealed the incident was actually an attempted auto theft. The vehicle was processed for fingerprints by officers on scene.

**DISORDERLY SUBJECT:**

On September 11<sup>th</sup> at approximately 3:00 PM, Officers responded to Our Lady of Sorrows on a report of a disorderly subject screaming and yelling inside the church. Officers arrived and located the suspect who was a 66-year-old white female resident of Farmington. Officers were able to calm the suspect down and she left the church without further incident. The church declined to pursue charges.

**POSSESSION OF COCAINE:**

On September 11<sup>th</sup> at approximately 5:00 AM, Officers conducted a traffic stop near the intersection of Nine Mile Road and Floral Street for suspected OWI. During the investigation, 88 grams of cocaine was located under the driver seat. The driver who was identified as a 44-year-old black male resident of Southfield was arrested for OWI, possession of cocaine and license violations. The driver was released pending charges from the Oakland County Prosecutor Office.
