### SUMMARY OF NOTABLE INCIDENTS

#### FRAUD:

On September 26th, a citizen came to the front desk to report that they were the victim of fraudulent activity. The citizen reported that they were contacted by an individual on his computer stating there was a fraud concern with their bank account. The individual then convinced the citizen to withdraw all their money from their bank account and transfer it to a bit coin account and gift cards. The account and gift card numbers were then given to the individual via a computer chat application.

#### ASSIST FARMINGTON HILLS PD:

On September 28<sup>th</sup>, Farmington Public Safety Officers assisted the Farmington Hills Police Department at a Farmington Hills car dealership that was being broken into. Both departments coordinated their efforts and were able to apprehend two individuals responsible for the break in. The individuals were attempting to steal numerous vehicles from the dealership before being interrupted by responding officers.

#### UDAA:

On September 29th at approximately 05:26 AM in the morning, a resident of the Meadows Subdivision discovered that her SUV had been taken sometime overnight. The vehicle had been parked out in front of her house. Officers canvassed the area and checked nearby ring cameras without any success. The case has been turned over to the detective bureau for follow-up.

#### TRAFFIC CRASH / OWI:

On September 30<sup>th</sup> at approximately 11:30 PM a Farmington Public Safety Officer was on a traffic stop in the area of Grand River Ave and Whittaker St. While contacting the driver of the vehicle he had just stopped his patrol vehicle was rear ended. It was quickly discovered that the person who had struck the patrol vehicle was intoxicated. A subsequent investigation showed that the driver's ability to drive was impaired by alcohol and he was arrested. No one was injured in the collision and the intoxicated driver was held at the Farmington Jail until sober and released.



**HIT AND RUN TRAFFIC CRASH:**

On October 1<sup>st</sup> around 10:55 PM a vehicle traveling west on Grand River Ave near Farmington Rd rear ended a vehicle. The at fault driver initially contacted the driver of the other vehicle but then fled the scene. Officers canvassed the area, and their investigation identified a possible suspect. The case was forwarded to the detective bureau for follow-up.
